This act shall apply only in Dallas 13 County. 14 Section 2. (a) The voters of Dallas County may authorize the sale of alcoholic beverages within the county on 15 16 Sunday by an election pursuant to this act, in the following 17 manner: 18 Within 30 days from the effective date of this act, 19 the Dallas County Commission, by resolution, may call an election for the county to determine the sentiment of the 20 21 voters of the county as to whether or not alcoholic beverages 22 can be legally sold or distributed on Sunday within the 23 county. (b) On the ballot to be used for such election, the 24

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question shall be in the following form: "Do you favor the

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legal sale and dispensing of alcoholic beverages within the county on Sunday between 12:00 P.M. (noon), and 9:30 P.M., and on those Sundays on which occurs New Year's Eve (December 31), after 12:00 P.M. (noon)? Yes \_\_\_\_ No \_\_\_."

5 (c) The first election and any subsequent elections shall be held and the officers appointed to hold the election 6 in the manner provided by law for holding other county 7 8 elections, and the returns thereof tabulated and results 9 certified as provided by law for county elections. Any Sunday 10 sales election shall be held as provided in this act as a special election or any subsequent county election following 11 the date of the resolution. 12

13 (d) Notice of the election shall be given by the 14 governing body of the Dallas County Commission by publication 15 or by posting the notice at the county courthouse apprising 16 the voters of the county, at least three weeks before the date 17 of the election, that an election shall be held to determine whether alcoholic beverages may be sold in the unincorporated 18 19 areas of the county on Sunday. The cost of the election shall 20 be paid out of the general fund of the county.

(e) Only qualified voters of the county may vote in
the election. If a majority of the voters voting in the
election vote "Yes," alcoholic beverages can be legally sold
or dispensed within the unincorporated areas of the county on
Sunday by licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board

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and the county serving the general public in accordance with 1 2 applicable laws and regulations between the hours of 12:00 3 P.M., noon, and 9:30 P.M. Except as authorized by law or during such hours, it shall be unlawful for any licensed 4 5 vendor to sell, dispense, or permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages on Sunday. Provided, that on those Sundays 6 on which occurs New Year's Eve, December 31, alcoholic 7 8 beverages may be sold or dispensed by such licensees pursuant to applicable laws and regulations any time after 12:00 P.M., 9 noon. The county may enact, by ordinance, such policies it 10 deems appropriate to regulate any aspect of Sunday alcoholic 11 12 beverages sales.

(f) If a majority of the voters voting in the election vote "No," alcoholic beverages may not be sold or dispensed in the unincorporated areas of the county on Sunday after the hour of 2:00 A.M., except as otherwise authorized by law or by subsequent election which legalizes the sale and dispensing of alcoholic beverages on Sunday.

Section 3. The provisions of this act are cumulative and supplemental to the present power and authority of the county and is not intended to, nor shall it be interpreted so as to, repeal any existing power or authority of the county now permitted under the general laws of the state, or under any local or special act of the Legislature.

2	immediately following its passage and approval by the
3	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
