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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

2 Section 1. Section 17-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, as last amended by Act 2021-243 of the 2021 Regular Session, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4

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"§17-3-8.

"(a) Each member of the board of registrars in the 6 7 Counties of Clay, Cleburne, Coosa, Dallas, Escambia, Geneva, 8 Lowndes, Perry, Sumter, and Wilcox may meet a maximum of 120 9 working days each fiscal year; each member of the board of 10 registrars in the Counties of Barbour, Blount, Butler, Fayette, Greene, Marengo, Pickens, Pike, Randolph, and Winston 11 may meet a maximum of 168 working days each fiscal year, 12 13 except in Pike County each board of registrars may meet up to an additional 30 session days each fiscal year, at the 14 15 discretion of the chair of the county commission, and such days shall be paid from the respective county funds; each 16 17 member of the board of registrars in the Counties of Coffee, 18 Talladega, and Tallapoosa may meet a maximum of 220 working days each fiscal year, except that in Talladega County the 19 20 board of registrars may meet up to an additional 30 session 21 days each fiscal year, at the discretion of the chair of the 22 county commission; each member of the board of registrars in the Counties of Dale, Franklin, Houston, Marion, Marshall, 23 24 Bullock, Macon, and Tuscaloosa may meet a maximum of 216 25 working days each fiscal year; each member of the board of 26 registrars in the Counties of Limestone and Shelby County may 27 meet a maximum of 167 working days each fiscal year; and each

1 member of the board of registrars in Russell County may meet a
2 maximum of 177 working days each fiscal year.

"(b) In the Counties of Choctaw, Colbert, Cullman,
Lauderdale, and Monroe, each member of the board of registrars
may meet a maximum of 199 working days each fiscal year.

"(c) Each member of the Board of Registrars of 6 7 Autauga, Elmore, and Bibb Counties may meet a maximum of 187 working days each fiscal year. Each member of the Board of 8 9 Registrars of Walker County may meet a maximum of 200 days 10 each fiscal year, and each member of the Board of Registrars of Lamar, Cherokee, Clarke, Conecuh, Crenshaw, Hale, and 11 Washington Counties may meet a maximum of 140 days each fiscal 12 13 year. Each member of the board of registrars in the following 14 counties may meet the following maximum number of working days 15 each fiscal year: Henry - 140 working days; Covington - 188 working days; DeKalb - 207 working days; Jackson - 207 working 16 days; Etowah - 207 working days; Chambers - 180 working days; 17 18 and Lawrence - 140 200 working days.

"(d) Each member of the board of registrars in the 19 20 Counties of Baldwin, Calhoun, Chilton, Lee, Limestone, 21 Madison, Mobile, Montgomery, St. Clair, and Morgan are 22 authorized to meet not more than five days each week for the 23 purpose of carrying out their official duties. Jefferson 24 County, which is now operating under the provisions of local 25 laws, shall be exempted from this section. Provided, however, that where the term each year is used in the local laws the 26 27 term means each fiscal year.

"(e) The actual number of working days to be used as session days shall be determined by a quorum of the board of registrars according to the needs of the county.

"(f) As many as 25 of the allotted working days may 4 5 be used for special registration sessions (i.e., those sessions held away from the courthouse in the several 6 7 precincts of the county or sessions held on Saturday or between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.). Notice of any 8 special session scheduled by the board shall be given at least 9 10 10 days prior to the special session by: (1) Bills posted at three or more public places in each election precinct 11 affected, if the session involves precinct visits; and (2) 12 13 advertisement once a week for two successive weeks in a 14 newspaper published in the county or by radio or television 15 announcements on a local station, or both by newspaper or 16 announcement."

17 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 18 first day of the third month following its passage and 19 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
