4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, an individual may be
6	excused from jury service only in certain situations.
7	This bill would allow an individual 75 years of
8	age or older to be excused from jury service on the
9	basis of his or her age and, upon the individual's
10	request, to be permanently exempt from jury service.

14	TO BE ENTITLED
15	AN ACT

17	Relating to jury service; to amend Sections 12-16-62
18	and 12-16-63, Code of Alabama 1975; to allow individuals 75
19	years of age or older to be excused from jury service and to
20	request a permanent exemption from jury service.
21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. Sections 12-16-62 and 12-16-63, Code of
23	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
24	"§12-16-62
25	(a) No qualified prospective juror is exempt from jury
26	service, except as provided in subsection (b).
27	(b) An individual who is 75 years of age or older may
28	submit a written statement to the court requesting that he or

29	she be permanently exempt from jury service. On receipt of the
30	request, the court shall remove the prospective juror from the
31	master jury list."

33	(a) The court, upon the request of a prospective juror
34	pursuant to this section, shall determine on the basis of
35	information provided during an interview with the prospective
36	juror or based on other competent evidence whether the
37	prospective juror should be excused from jury service.
38	(b) (1) <u>A person An individual</u> who is not disqualified
39	for jury service may apply to be excused from jury service by
40	the court only upon a in each of the following circumstances:
41	a. The individual is 75 years of age or older.
42	b. The individual provides a showing of undue or
43	extreme physical or financial hardship $\underline{\cdot \tau}$
44	c. The individual has a mental or physical condition
45	that incapacitates the person, him or her.
46	<u>d. or public Public</u> necessity .
47	(2) An individual may be excused from jury service for
48	a period of up to 24 months, at the conclusion of which the
49	personindividual may be directed to reappear for jury service
50	in accordance with the court's direction.
51	(1) A person(3) An individual asking to be excused
52	based on undue or extreme physical or financial hardship shall
53	take all actions necessary to have obtained a ruling on that
54	request by no later than the date on which the individual is
55	scheduled to appear for jury duty. Documentation of such

56 hardship shall be provided to the court upon request.

57 (2) (4) For purposes of this article, undue or extreme 58 physical or financial hardship is limited to any of the following circumstances in which an individual would: 59 60 a. Be required to abandon a person an individual under his or her personal care or supervision due to the 61 62 impossibility of obtaining an appropriate substitute caregiver 63 during the period of participation in the jury pool or on the 64 jury. 65 b. Incur costs that would have a substantial adverse 66 impact on the payment of the individual's necessary daily 67 living expenses or on those for whom he or she provides the 68 principal means of support. 69 c. Suffer physical hardship that would result in illness or disease. 70 71 (3) Undue or extreme physical or financial hardship does not exist solely based on the fact that a prospective 72 73 juror will be required to be absent from his or her place of 74 employment. 75 (c) The excusal of a person an individual from jury service pursuant to subsection (b) shall not affect the 76 77 person's right to one automatic postponement under Section 78 12-16-63.1." 79 Section 2. This act shall become effective October 1, 2024. 80
