8 TO BE ENTITLED  
9 AN ACT

11 To make a supplemental appropriation from the  
12 Education Trust Fund Advancement and Technology Fund to the  
13 public institutions of higher education in the amount of  
14 \$15,089,140 and to the Department of Education, the Board of  
15 Trustees of the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind, the  
16 Board of Youth Services School Districts, the Board of  
17 Directors of the Alabama School of Fine Arts, and the Board of  
18 Trustees of the Alabama School of Math and Science in the  
19 amount of \$41,297,782 for the fiscal year ending September 30,  
20 2017.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

22 Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations  
23 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a  
24 total of \$15,089,140 from the Education Trust Fund Advancement  
25 and Technology Fund to the public institutions of higher edu-  
26 cation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017. This  
27 appropriation shall be expended for: (1) repairs or deferred

1 maintenance of facilities for public education purposes in the  
2 state; (2) insuring facilities; or (3) the acquisition or pur-  
3 chase of education technology and equipment, or both. This  
4 appropriation shall be distributed as follows:

1           Section 2. In addition to all other appropriations  
2 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a  
3 total of \$41,297,782 from the Education Trust Fund Advancement  
4 and Technology Fund to the Department of Education, the Board  
5 of Trustees of the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind, the  
6 Board of Youth Services School Districts, the Board of  
7 Directors of the Alabama School of Fine Arts, and the Board of  
8 Trustees of the Alabama School of Math and Science for the  
9 fiscal year ending September 30, 2017. This appropriation  
10 shall be expended for: (1) repairs or deferred maintenance of  
11 facilities for public education purposes in the state; (2)  
12 classroom instructional support pursuant to 16-13-231(b)(2)c  
13 and Section 16-13-231.3; (3) insuring facilities; (4)  
14 transportation pursuant to Section 16-13-233; or (5) purchase  
15 of education technology and equipment or both.

16           Section 3. (a) The funds appropriated herein to the  
17 local school systems shall be allocated as follows with fifty  
18 percent (50%) of the funds allocated to systems that have not  
19 provided devices, wireless connectivity, or train the trainer:

9 prior approval of the State Superintendent of Education.

10 Section 4. This act shall become effective  
11 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or  
12 upon its otherwise becoming law.
