1 "(a) No incorporated municipality shall have the 2 power to enact any ordinance, rule, or regulation which shall tax, restrict, prevent, or in any way affect the possession or 3 4 ownership of handguns by the citizens of this state. The entire subject matter of handguns is reserved to the State 5 Legislature. This section shall not be construed to limit or 6 7 restrict the power of a municipality to adopt ordinances which make the violation of a state handgun law a violation of a 8 municipal ordinance to the same extent as other state law 9 10 violations, or to limit or restrict the power of a municipal court to exercise concurrent jurisdiction with the district 11 court over violations of state handgun laws which may be 12 13 prosecuted as breaches of a municipal ordinance.

14 "(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), a municipality by ordinance adopted pursuant to this chapter may regulate and 15 prohibit a person from carrying a handgun or other firearm in 16 17 any municipal buildings or on any municipal property, including, but not limited to, in a city or town hall or 18 council chamber, in municipal administration buildings, or at 19 municipal parks and recreation facilities and sports 20 21 facilities."

22 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 23 first day of the third month following its passage and 24 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
