17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:		
18	Section 1. Section 12-11-30, Code of Alabama 1975,		
19	is amended to read as follows:		
20	"§12-11-30.		
21	"(1) CIVIL. The circuit court shall have exclusive		
22	original jurisdiction of all civil actions in which the matter		
23	in controversy exceeds ten thousand dollars (\$10,000),		
24	exclusive of interest and costs, and shall exercise original		
25	jurisdiction concurrent with the district court in all civil		
26	actions in which the matter in controversy exceeds three		
27	thousand dollars (\$3,000), exclusive of interest and costs.		

"(2) CRIMINAL. The circuit court shall have exclusive original jurisdiction of all felony prosecutions and of misdemeanor or ordinance violations which are lesser included offenses within a felony charge or which arise from the same incident as a felony charge; except, that the district court shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the circuit court to receive pleas of guilty in felony cases not punishable by sentence of death. The circuit court may, on conviction of a defendant, upon a showing of inability to make immediate payment of fine and costs, continue the case from time to time to permit the fine and costs to be paid.

- "(3) APPELLATE. The circuit court shall have appellate jurisdiction of civil, criminal, and juvenile cases in district court and prosecutions for ordinance violations in municipal courts, except in cases in which direct appeal to the Courts of Civil or Criminal Appeals is provided by law or rule. Appeals to the circuit court shall be tried de novo, with or without a jury, as provided by law.
- "(4) SUPERINTENDENCE OF DISTRICT, MUNICIPAL AND PROBATE COURTS. The circuit court shall exercise a general superintendence over all district courts, municipal courts, and probate courts.
- "(5) CONTEMPTS. The circuit court may punish contempts by fines not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) and by imprisonment not exceeding five days. In a case in which a person violates an order of the circuit court by failing to pay child support, for the first offense, the

1	circuit court may punish the person for contempt by imposing a
2	fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100), by imprisonment
3	not exceeding five days, or both, and for a subsequent
4	offense, the court may impose a fine not to exceed one hundred
5	dollars (\$100), by imprisonment not exceeding 15 days, or
6	both. The power of the circuit court to enforce its orders and
7	judgements judgments by determinations of civil contempt shall
8	be unaffected by this section.
9	"(6) GENERAL. The circuit court shall have other
10	powers as provided by law."
11	Section 2. The punishment provisions for contempt in
12	circuit courts in Section 12-11-30, Code of Alabama 1975,
13	shall apply in district courts pursuant to Section 12-12-6,
14	Code of Alabama 1975, and in juvenile courts pursuant to
15	Section 12-15-110, Code of Alabama 1975.
16	Section 3. This act shall become effective
17	immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
