A company that, in the prior 12 year, employed at least 12 percent of its eligible 13 employees as veterans who received an honorable or 14 general discharge receive an additional 0.5 percent 15 jobs credit. 16 This bill would provide that a company that 17 employs eligible employees by or through a 18 qualifying project located within a former active duty military installation closed by the Base 19 20 Realignment and Closure process are entitled to the 21 additional 0.5 percent jobs credit. 22 23 A BILL 24 TO BE ENTITLED 25 AN ACT 26

To amend Sections 1, 2, and 3 of Act 2015-27, now 1 2 appearing as Sections 40-18-370 and 40-18-376.2, Code of 3 Alabama 1975, relating to the Alabama Jobs Act, to provide 4 that companies that employed eligible employees by or through 5 a qualifying project located within a former active duty military installation closed by the Base Realignment and 6 7 Closure process are entitled to an additional jobs credit. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 9 Section 1. Sections 1, 2, and 3 of Act 2015-27, now 10 appearing as Sections 40-18-370 and 40-18-376.2, Code of 11 Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: 12 "§40-18-370. 13 "(a) This article shall be known and may be cited as the Alabama Jobs Act. 14 15 "(b) The Legislature makes the following findings: 16 "(1) The economic well-being of the citizens of the 17 state will be enhanced by the increased development and growth 18 of employment within Alabama. 19 "(2) It is in the best interests of the state to 20 provide certain incentives to allow the state to foster 21 economic development through the recruitment of quality 22 projects and the expansion of existing businesses within 23 Alabama. 24 "(3) The incentives provided for in this article do 25 not raise any taxes for any individuals or businesses in Alabama under state law. 26

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"(4) The incentives provided in this article will
 allow the state to encourage the creation of new jobs that may
 not otherwise exist within the State of Alabama.

4 "(5) The incentives provided in this article will 5 increase revenues for the state without increasing taxes.

6 "(6) The Constitution of the State of Alabama grants 7 the Legislature the authority to approve and authorize 8 exemptions, exclusions, deductions, and credits from taxation 9 in order to define the net proceeds of any tax payable under 10 state law.

"(7) The Constitution of the State of Alabama was framed, and the laws of the state were enacted, with the goal of protecting, encouraging, and developing individual enterprise.

15 "(8) The incentives provided in this article will16 not decrease the salary paid to any education personnel.

17 "(9) The powers to be granted and the purposes to be 18 accomplished by this article will create an environment for 19 the recruitment of quality projects and the expansion of 20 existing businesses within Alabama.

"(10) Economic development through tax and financial incentives benefits the citizens of the state and is a public purpose of the state.

24 "(c) In addition to the definitions found at Section 25 40-18-1, the following words and phrases shall have the 26 following meanings: "(1) APPROVED COMPANY. Any company determined by the
 Secretary of Commerce and the Governor to meet the criteria
 provided in Section 40-18-373.

"(2) CAPITAL INVESTMENT. All costs and expenses 4 5 incurred by the incentivized company in connection with the acquisition, construction, installation, and equipping of a 6 7 qualifying project, if such costs are required to be 8 capitalized for purposes of the federal income tax, determined without regard to any rule that permits expenditures properly 9 10 chargeable to a capital account to be treated as current 11 expenditures. However, for any project involving the 12 extraction of natural resources, the capital investment shall 13 not include the costs of acquiring land, land recording fees, architectural and engineering services, environmental studies 14 and environmental mitigation. 15

16 "(3) COMPANY. Anyone or anything which has the17 powers to own a project and have employees.

18 "(4) ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES. Those employee positions 19 set forth in a project agreement that will be the result of 20 new jobs created by or through a qualifying project.

21 "(5) EMPLOYEES. Some or all of those persons
22 employed and residing in Alabama:

"a. Who are being paid directly by an approved
company, related company, common paymaster, joint venturer, or
leasing company for working at a qualifying project;

26 "b. Whom the approved company, related company,
27 common paymaster, joint venturer or leasing company identifies

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1 as its employees to the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, the 2 Department of Revenue, or the Department of Labor on returns 3 or reports filed with the foregoing, including, but not 4 limited to, IRS Form 941; and

5 "c. Who are assigned to a qualifying project for a 6 period of at least one year.

7 "(6) INCENTIVE PERIOD. The period or periods of time
8 during which an incentivized company can receive one or more
9 of the jobs act incentives.

10 "(7) INCENTIVIZED COMPANY. An approved company and 11 any related company that are allowed to claim either or both 12 <u>one or more</u> of the jobs act incentives as provided for in the 13 project agreement.

14 "(8) INVESTMENT CREDIT. The annual incentive15 provided in Section 40-18-376.

16 "(9) JOBS ACT INCENTIVES. The jobs credit and the 17 investment credit as authorized and provided for in this 18 article.

"(10) JOBS CREDIT. The annual incentive provided in
Section 40-18-375.

"(11) NAICS CODE. Any sector, subsector, industry
 group, industry or national industry of the 2012 North
 American Industry Classification System, or any similar
 classification system developed in conjunction with the United
 States Department of Commerce or Office of Management and
 Budget.

"(12) PROJECT. Any land, building, or other 1 2 improvements, and all real and personal properties, whether or 3 not contiguous and whether or not previously in existence, if 4 in Alabama and if deemed necessary or useful in connection 5 with an activity listed in Section 40-18-372(a). "(13) PROJECT AGREEMENT. The agreement entered into 6 7 between an approved company and the Governor establishing the 8 terms and conditions for the provision of the jobs act incentives, as provided for in Section 40-18-374. 9 10 "(14) QUALIFYING PROJECT. Any project to be 11 undertaken by an approved company that satisfies Section 12 40-18-372. 13 "(15) RELATED COMPANY. Any company that is under common ownership, management, or control with a company or an 14 15 approved company, as the case may be. 16 "(16) UTILITY TAXES. The taxes imposed by Sections 17 40-21-82 and 40-21-102. 18 "(17) WAGES. Total wages of an employee (including 19 gross wages, salaries, overtime and bonuses), defined by 20 reference to Section 25-4-16(b), without application of Sections 25-4-16(b)(1), 25-4-16(b)(2)a., 25-4-16(b)(3), and 21 22 25-4-16(b)(4). "§40-18-376.2. 23 24 "(a) The provisions in this section shall apply to 25 the following: 26 "any (1) Any incentivized company that employed, in 27 the prior year, at least 12 percent of its eligible employees

as veterans who received an honorable or general discharge. 1 2 The calculation of the percentage of eligible employees who are veterans shall be made using the method provided in a 3 4 project agreement. 5 "(2) Any incentivized company that employed eligible employees by or through a qualifying project located within a 6 7 former active duty military installation closed by the Base 8 Realignment and Closure process. "(b)(1) Any incentivized company described by 9 10 subdivision (1) of subsection (a) shall receive an additional 0.5 percent jobs credit provided in Section 40-18-375(a) on 11 12 the wages paid during the prior year to eligible employees who 13 are veterans. 14 "(2) Any incentivized company described by subdivision (2) of subsection (a) shall receive an additional 15 16 0.5 percent jobs credit provided in Section 40-18-375(a) on 17 the wages paid during the prior year to its employees. 18 "(c) No incentivized company claiming the credit provided by subdivision (1) of subsection (b) shall also claim 19 20 the credit provided by Article 13 of this chapter for any 21 portion of the project. 22 "(d) The Department of Labor shall periodically 23 verify the actual number of veterans employed by the 24 incentivized company described in subdivision (1) of 25 subsection (a) and the wages of the veterans during the 26 relevant year. If the Department of Labor is not able to 27 provide the verification utilizing all available resources, it

1 may request any additional information from the incentivized 2 company as may be necessary."

3 Section 2. This act shall become effective
4 immediately following its passage and approval by the
5 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
