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2 3 4 SYNOPSIS: 5 This bill would provide that a state agency may 6 not execute a settlement agreement for a claim made 7 against the state unless the state agency has 8 sufficient funds available to the state agency to pay 9 the full amount owed under the settlement agreement. This bill would also provide that if a state 10 11 agency does not have sufficient funds available to pay 12 the full amount owed under a proposed settlement agreement, the state agency must provide the terms of 13 14 the settlement agreement to specified public officials 15 at least 90 days in advance of executing a settlement 16 agreement. 17 18 19 A BILL 20 TO BE ENTITLED 21 AN ACT 22 23 Relating to state agencies; to prohibit state agencies

30 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

31 Section 1. (a) As used in this section, "state agency" 32 means any department, agency, board, commission, or bureau, 33 and "settlement" means the compromise of any claim made 34 against a state agency or the entry into a consent decree, 35 whether in the course of litigation or not, and whether the 36 compromise contemplates the payment of money or a change in 37 practices.

38 (b) No state agency shall have the authority to execute 39 a settlement unless the state agency has sufficient funds 40 available at the time of settlement or compromise to pay the 41 full amount of the settlement.

42 (c) If a state agency does not have sufficient funds 43 available to pay the full amount of a proposed settlement, the state agency, at least 90 days before entering into the 44 45 settlement, shall provide the proposed terms of the settlement 46 to the Governor, the Attorney General, the Speaker of the 47 House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the 48 Senate, the Chair of the House of Representatives Ways and 49 Means Education Committee, the Chair of the House of 50 Representatives Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the 51 Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation Education Committee, 52 the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund 53 Committee, the Finance Director, and the Director of the Legislative Services Agency. 54

55 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 56 1, 2024.
