- (2) LAW ENFORCEMENT PURPOSES. Purposes reasonably related to the performance of duties by law enforcement agencies and their officers and employees, including, but not limited to, operating budgets or debt.
- Section 3. Any other local law relating to Colbert County which is in conflict with this act is repealed to the extent that it conflicts with this act.
- Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
