5	TO BE ENTITLED
6	AN ACT
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9	Relating to Montgomery County and to municipalities in
10	the county having a population of 5,000 or more people,
11	according to the most recent or any subsequent federal census;
12	to amend Section 45-51A-32.113, as last amended by Act
13	2022-370 of the 2022 Regular Session, Code of Alabama 1975,
14	establishing a countywide personnel system; to provide that
15	certain city employees are members of the exempt service of
16	the municipality.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. Section 45-51A-32.113 of the Code of Alabama
19	1975, is amended to read as follows:
20	"\$45-51A-32.113
21	(a) This subpart shall apply to all officers and
22	employees in the service of the county and affected
23	municipalities, except the following:
24	(1) Elective officials. Provided however, that in the
25	event the status of an elective officer of the county or
26	municipality is changed to that of an appointive officer, then
27	at the expiration of the term of office of any such officer,
28	the individual holding the office at the time of the



expiration of the term, providing that he or she shall have
served in the position for a period of at least six months

continuously, immediately prior to the expiration of the term
of office, shall assume regular status in the competitive
service without preliminary examination or working tests and
shall thereafter be subject in all respects to this subpart.

(2) Members of appointive boards, commissions, and committees.

- (3) All employees or appointees of the city or county board of education, or individuals engaged in the profession of teaching or in supervising teaching in the public schools; excepting, however, personnel employed in kindergartens or schools not a part of the city or county school system operated under the direction and supervision of the city or county board of education.
- (4) Attorneys, physicians, surgeons, and dentists who, with the express or implied permission of any appointing authority or of the county or municipality, hold themselves out for employment by others in the same or a like line of work as that performed by them for such appointing authority; excepting, however, municipal recorders or assistant recorders and city or municipal prosecutors or assistant city or municipal prosecutors.
- 52 (5) The personnel director provided for by this subpart.
 - (6) Individuals in the classified service within the meaning of and subject to the state Merit System under any present or future law, and so long as any such law remains



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- (7) One private secretary or executive assistant of a member of the governing body of such municipality, the bailiff appointed by each judge of the circuit court, and two clerks to be designated by each county elective official and also the register of the circuit court except the member of the board of revenue; and any employee receiving his or her compensation from any elected official of the county.
- (8) One clerk, deputy, or employee to be named by the clerk of the circuit court for his or her office, and one clerk, deputy, or employee to be named by the register of the circuit court for his or her office.
- (9) a. The chief of police, fire chief, chief financial officer or director of finance, chief operating officer, special assistant to the mayor, city attorney, director of the office of city investigations, head of the department of engineering and environmental services director of public works, head of the inspection department, head of the planning department, head of the communications department, director of traffic engineering, head of the department of parks and recreation, head of the building maintenance department, and head of the sanitation department of any affected municipality, and any private secretary, executive assistant, or special assistant of any of the officers and employees listed in this paragraph, all of whom shall be appointed and serve at the pleasure of the mayor of the affected municipality. In addition, all of the following shall be appointed and serve at the pleasure of the mayor: Chief of

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85 staff, chief administrative officer, director of office of 86 violence prevention, director of emergency communications, 87 director of the emergency management agency, director of 88 economic development, director of community development, 89 director of neighborhood services, director of the zoo, 90 director of riverfront facilities and special services, 91 director of procurement, director of risk management, director 92 of grants department, director of street maintenance, director 93 of engineering and landfill, director of general services, director of parking management, director of fleet management, 94 95 director of cultural affairs, director of city events, library director, museum director, chief technology officer, and 96 senior policy advisor. Any individual appointed to a position 97 pursuant to this subdivision shall meet at least the minimum 98 99 qualifications for the position as shall be established by the personnel board. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this 100 101 subpart, the compensation of individuals appointed pursuant to 102 this subdivision shall be set by the personnel board pursuant 103 to a pay and classification study. 104 b. If -a an individual is removed by the mayor from any 105 of the positions listed in paragraph a. for any reason other 106 than for cause of willful neglect of duty, corruption in 107 office, incompetency, or malfeasance, and if that individual 108 was a member of the competitive or classified service of the 109 county and affected municipalities at the time of initial 110 appointment to that position by the mayor, that individual may return to the competitive or classified service as if he or 111

she had never been appointed to or removed from the position

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113 by the mayor.

114	(b) Offices, positions, and employments not exempted
115	above shall constitute the competitive or classified service
116	of the county and affected municipalities. It is intended
117	hereby to include within the competitive or classified service
118	all offices, positions, and employments in each such county
119	and any such municipalities therein as these offices,
120	positions, and employment now exist, or as they may hereafter
121	exist, the holders of which are paid, whether by salaries,
122	wages, and fees, in whole or in part from funds of any such
123	county or municipality, or the holders of which receive their
124	compensation from any elected official and perform duties
125	pertaining to the office of such elected official or officer
126	except those hereinabove numerated in this section. It is also
127	intended hereby that the competitive or classified service
128	shall include all personnel of any public corporation, board,
129	committee, or commission, appointed or created by the
130	governing body of any such county or municipality whether the
131	salaries, wages, or compensation of such officers or employees
132	are paid directly by the county or municipality; provided,
133	however, the appointed members of any such public corporation,
134	board, committee, or commission shall not be included in the
135	competitive or classified service."
136	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
137	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
138	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
