5	Under existing law, an individual performing the
6	duties of a public safety telecommunicator must be
7	certified by the Statewide 911 Board. Individuals hired
8	for such positions must be certified within 180 days.
9	This bill would provide that an individual
10	serving as a public safety telecommunicator must be
11	certified by the Statewide 911 Board only if required
12	by the sheriff of the county or the chief of police of
13	the local municipality, as applicable.

24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Section 11-98-16, Code of Alabama 1975, is
26	amended to read as follows:
27	" \$11-98-16
28	On or after July 1, 2022, anAn individual performing

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29	the duties of a public safety telecommunicator, as defined in
30	Section 11-98-1, and employed by a primary PSAP receiving 911
31	calls, shall may be required by the sheriff of the county or
32	chief of police of the municipality, as applicable, to be
33	certified under rules established by the Statewide 911 Board.
3 4	Individuals hired on or after July 1, 2022, shall have 180
35	days to be enrolled in the certification process, but shall be
36	allowed to perform the duties of a public safety
37	telecommunicator without certification until the expiration of
38	the 180-day period. Any individual performing the duties of
39	public safety telecommunicator for a primary PSAP receiving
10	911 calls on or before June 30, 2022, shall not be required to
11	complete the coursework to be certified under rules
12	established by the board."
13	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
14	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
15	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
