This section does 13 not include any provision concerning the display of the Ten Commandments. 14 Section 263 of Article XIV of the 15 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as 16 17 Section 263 of Article XIV of the Official 18 Recompilation of the Constitution of 1901, as 19 amended, prohibits public school funds being appropriated to any sectarian or denominational 20 21 school. 22 Amendment 622 to the Constitution of Alabama 23 of 1901, now appearing as Section 3.01 of Article I 24 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution 25 of 1901, as amended, the Alabama Religious Freedom Amendment, provides that freedom of religion may 26 27 not be burdened by state and local law.

1 This bill would propose a constitutional 2 amendment which would provide that property belonging to the state may be used to display the 3 4 Ten Commandments and that the right to display the Ten Commandments on property owned or administrated 5 6 by a public school or public body is not restrained 7 or abridged. This bill would also provide that every 8 9 person would be at liberty to worship according to

his or her own conscience; and that no person would be compelled to attend or support a place of worship or a minister.

13This bill would also provide that the civil14and political rights, privileges, and capacities of15no person may be diminished or enlarged on account16of his or her religious beliefs.

17 This bill would prohibit the expenditure of 18 public funds in defense of the constitutionality of 19 this amendment.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

14 Every person shall be at liberty to worship God 15 according to the dictates of his or her own conscience. No person shall be compelled to attend, or, against his or her 16 17 consent, to contribute to the erection or support of any place of religious worship, or to pay tithes, taxes, or other rates 18 for the support of any minister of the gospel. Property 19 20 belonging to the state may be used to display the Ten 21 Commandments, and the right of a public school and public body 22 to display the Ten Commandments on property owned or 23 administrated by a public school or public body in this state 24 is not restrained or abridged. The civil and political rights, 25 privileges, and capacities of no person shall be diminished or enlarged on account of his or her religious belief. No public 26

1 funds may be expended in defense of the constitutionality of 2 this amendment.

3 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 4 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 5 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 6 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 7 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 8 state.

9 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 10 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 11 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 12 following description of the substance or subject matter of 13 the proposed constitutional amendment:

14 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 15 Alabama of 1901, providing for certain religious rights and 16 liberties; authorizing the display of the Ten Commandments on 17 state property and property owned or administrated by a public 18 school or public body; and prohibiting the expenditure of 19 public funds in defense of the constitutionality of this 20 amendment.
