17 "(c) Any person individual entering into a business license transaction or attempting to enter into a business 18 license transaction with this state or a political subdivision 19 of this state shall be required to demonstrate his or her 20 21 United States citizenship, or if he or she is an alien, his or 22 her lawful presence in the United States to the person 23 individual conducting the business license transaction on 24 behalf of this state or a political subdivision of this state. 25 United States citizenship shall be demonstrated by 26 presentation of one of the documents listed in subsection (k) 27 of Section 31-13-28. An alien's lawful presence in the United States shall be demonstrated by this state's or a political subdivision of this state's verification of the alien's lawful presence through the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements program operated by the Department of Homeland Security, or by other verification with the Department of Homeland Security pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1373(c).

9 "(e) An agency of this state or a county, city, 10 town, or other political subdivision of this state may not 11 consider race, color, or national origin in the enforcement of 12 this section except to the extent permitted by the United 13 States Constitution or the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

14 "(f) In the enforcement of this section, an alien's 15 immigration status shall be determined by verification of the 16 alien's immigration status with the federal government 17 pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1373(c). An official of this state or 18 political subdivision of this state shall not attempt to 19 independently make a final determination of whether an alien 20 is lawfully present in the United States."
