Section 1. Section 17-3-30, Code of Alabama 1975, is
amended to read as follows:

"Any person possessing the qualifications of an 4 5 elector set out in Article 8 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as modified by federal law, including any person who is 6 7 not serving a court-ordered sentence of imprisonment resulting from the conviction of any felony offense, and not laboring 8 9 under any other disqualification listed therein in Article 8, 10 shall be an elector, and shall be entitled to register and to vote at any election by the people." 11

12 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 13 first day of the third month following its passage and 14 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
