8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, termination dates are  
9 established for enumerated state agencies. The  
10 agencies are periodically reviewed by the Alabama  
11 Sunset Committee. After the review process is  
12 completed, the committee prepares its  
13 recommendations for the agencies to the Legislature  
14 in the form of sunset bills which either continue,  
15 terminate, or continue with modification each  
16 agency reviewed.

17 This bill would provide for the continuance  
18 of the Board of Examiners of Mine Personnel, with  
19 the following change: To remove the board from the  
20 sunset review process.

26 Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the  
27 existence and functioning of the Board of Examiners of Mine

1 Personnel with certain modifications; to remove the board from  
2 the sunset review process.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the  
5 Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Board of  
6 Examiners of Mine Personnel, with the additional  
7 recommendation for statutory change as set out in Section 3.

8 Section 2. The existence and functioning of the  
9 Board of Examiners of Mine Personnel, created and functioning  
10 pursuant to Sections 25-9-1 to 25-9-18, inclusive, Code of  
11 Alabama 1975, is continued, and those code sections are  
12 expressly preserved.

13 Section 3. Commencing on the effective date of this  
14 act, the Board of Examiners of Mine Personnel is not subject  
15 to review as an enumerated agency under the Alabama Sunset  
16 Law.

17 Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the  
18 recommendations of the Sunset Committee as provided in  
19 Sections 1, 2, and 3.

20 Section 5. This act shall become effective  
21 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or  
22 its otherwise becoming law.
