4 (b) The requirements in subsection (a) shall be in
5 addition to any other continuing legal education requirements
6 provided by rule or regulation of the Alabama State Bar.

7 (c) All continuing legal education courses in the
8 area of immigration law shall be approved by the Alabama State
9 Bar and subject to all rules and regulations of the Alabama
10 State Bar in order to meet the requirements of subsection (a).

(d) Any person subject to the requirements of this section shall also be subject to all rules and regulations adopted by the Alabama State Bar relating to continuing legal education, including, but not limited to, any penalty for failure to complete continuing legal education requirements.

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective on 17 January 1, 2013 following its passage and approval by the 18 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
