SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the State Board of Health licenses emergency medical personnel and adopts rules relating to emergency medical services. An advisory board recommends the establishment of rules and standards relating to emergency medical services and the licensing of emergency medical service personnel. Under existing law, the board meets at least once a year and at

the call of the State Health Officer.

This bill would specify that one member of the advisory board would be designated by the Alabama Emergency Medical Services Association in lieu of the existing designation and would expand the membership of the advisory board by adding a member designated by the Alabama Council on EMS and a member designated by the Alabama Air Ambulance. This bill would also specify that only members of the advisory board who hold a current EMSP license would be able to vote on matters pertaining to the adoption of EMS rules, licensing of EMSPs

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 22-18-5, Code of Alabama 1975, is
15	amended to read as follows:

17	"(a) There shall be an advisory board of 25 members
18	to assist in the establishment of rules, regulations and
19	standards regarding EMSP licensure, education requirements,
20	discipline of EMSP, and EMS rules promulgation necessary to
21	carry out the provisions of this article. Only licensed EMSP
22	appointed by the Alabama Ambulance Association, Alabama
23	Association of Rescue Squads, the Professional Firefighters
24	Association of Alabama, the Alabama Association of Volunteer
25	Fire Departments, the Alabama Association of Fire Chiefs, the
26	Alabama Emergency Medical Services Education Committee, the

3	may vote on matters pertaining to the adoption of EMS rules,

serve for the remainder of the unexpired term. Any vacancy shall be filled by the original organization selecting said member. Any member who fails to attend at least one-half of all meetings within a calendar year shall be deemed to have vacated his or her position and shall be replaced by the appointing organization. Members of the advisory board shall serve without compensation but and shall not be entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred in the performance of the duties of their office as provided in Article 2 of Chapter 7 of Title 36 of this code.

"(e) With the consent of the majority of the members of the advisory board, the chair shall set requirements for proxy representation, voting, and the establishment of a quorum provided that no such rule is in conflict with any other provision of the law. For the purposes of voting on any matter pertaining to the adoption of EMS rules, EMS licensure, EMS education requirements and discipline of EMSP, it shall only be necessary to establish a quorum from among those advisory board members that are licensed EMSP."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
