8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, each waterfowl season a
9 person must purchase an annual stamp from the judge
10 of probate or another agent authorized by the
11 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources in
12 order to hunt waterfowl. There is no provision in
13 current law for the issuance of a lifetime
14 waterfowl stamp.

15 This bill would provide for the department
16 to issue a lifetime waterfowl stamp and establishes
17 the fees for a lifetime stamp. The bill would also
18 authorize cost-of-living adjustments for the
19 lifetime fees.

25 To amend Section 9-11-433, Code of Alabama 1975,
26 relating to issuance of annual stamps for waterfowl hunting;
27 to provide for the issuance of lifetime waterfowl stamps and

1 to establish fees; and to authorize for adjustment of the
2 fees.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. Section 9-11-433, Code of Alabama 1975,
5 is amended to read as follows:

6 "§9-11-433.

7 "(a) A stamp shall be issued to each hunting license
8 applicant by the judge of probate or issuing officer of any
9 county of the state or other authorized license agent as
10 provided herein upon the payment of a fee of ten dollars
11 (\$10). Each stamp shall be valid for the duration of one
12 hunting season as established by the department. Stamps shall
13 be available for sale prior to any waterfowl season, including
14 any special season which may precede the regular season.

15 "(b) In lieu of an annual stamp, a lifetime
16 migratory waterfowl stamp may be purchased by or for
17 individuals meeting the residency requirements set out in
18 Section 9-11-44 for the following license fees:

19 "(1) Persons less than two years old, sixty-five
20 dollars (\$65).

21 "(2) Persons age two through 11 years old,
22 eighty-five dollars (\$85).

23 "(3) Persons age 12 through 49 years, one hundred
24 five dollars (\$105).

25 "(4) Persons age 50 years and above, sixty-five
26 dollars (\$65).

1 "(5) The stamp fee provided in this subsection may
2 be subject to periodic adjustments by the Department of
3 Conservation and Natural Resources upon approval of the
4 commissioner based on increases in the Consumer Price Index in
5 the same manner as other fishing and hunting licenses and fees
6 are adjusted pursuant to Section 9-11-68.

7 "~~(b)~~ (c) The judge of probate, or issuing officer, or
8 other authorized license agent as provided herein shall be
9 allowed a fee of one dollar (\$1) for each license issued,
10 which issuing fee shall be in addition to the cost of the
11 stamp and shall be subject to adjustment as provided in
12 Section 9-11-68. In counties where the judge of probate or
13 issuing officer is on the fee system, the issuing fee shall be
14 retained by the judge of probate or issuing officer, and in
15 counties where the judge of probate or issuing officer is on a
16 salary basis, the fee shall be paid into the county treasury
17 to the credit of the appropriate fund.

18 "~~(c)~~ (d) Other license agents as authorized by the
19 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources may issue
20 migratory waterfowl stamps, provided the other authorized
21 license agents prepurchase sheets of stamps for resale at face
22 value plus the issuance fee provided herein. An agent shall
23 place an initial order for one or more sheets of 10 stamps
24 each for the license year. At the end of the license period,
25 the agent may return unsold stamps for a refund."

1 Section 2. This act shall become effective
2 immediately following its passage and approval by the
3 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
