The driver or any other person who has moved a motor vehicle from the 6 7 roadway as provided herein before the arrival of a law enforcement officer shall not be considered at fault regarding 8 the cause of the accident solely by reason of moving the 9 10 vehicle and shall not be considered as having failed to stop and report a traffic accident. 11 12 "(b) Employees of the Department of Transportation may move a vehicle, require a vehicle to be moved, or assist 13 in the moving of a vehicle from the roadway under the 14 15 jurisdiction of the department if the vehicle is disabled as a result of an accident and the disabled vehicle creates a 16 17 traffic hazard or is obstructing traffic and the vehicle may be safely moved. A vehicle may also be moved by the driver of 18 the vehicle or with the assistance of a towing or recovery 19 vehicle. A vehicle disabled as a result of an accident with 20 21 apparent serious physical injury to or death of any person may 22 not be moved until directed by a law enforcement officer. 23 "(c) This section does not relive a driver from 24 complying with any other duties imposed in this chapter. 25 (d) The Department of Transportation and its employees shall be immune from any damages or claims resulting 26 27 from the exercise of their authority under this section.

1 "(b)(e) The director shall revoke the driver's
2 license of a person convicted under this section."
3 Section 2. This act shall become effective
4 immediately following its passage and approval by the
5 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
