5 COMMENDING SENATOR DEL MARSH ON HIS RETIREMENT AND
6 YEARS OF SERVICE.

8 WHEREAS, with the conclusion of the 2019-2022
9 quadrennium of the Legislature of Alabama, Senator Del Marsh
10 will end an accomplished legislative career spanning over two
11 decades; and

12 WHEREAS, Senator Marsh first won election to
13 represent the 12th Senate District in the Alabama Senate in
14 1998, and has been reelected to that office five times; in
15 2010, he was chosen as President Pro Tempore of the Alabama
16 Senate, an office he held until last year; when a vacancy
17 occurred in the office of Lieutenant Governor following
18 succession of Governor Kay Ivey to her current position in
19 2017, Senator Marsh presided over the Senate for two years;
20 and

21 WHEREAS, just as anyone who knows Senator Marsh can
22 confirm, sitting on the chair as presiding officer of the
23 Senate was not for him; the "honey badger" of the State House
24 needed to work the floor, sniff for votes, and claw his way to
25 bill passage; he felt that the chair sometimes got in his way;

1 as such, he stepped down from his post as President Pro
2 Tempore, in order to re-enter the fray; and

3 WHEREAS, Senator Marsh treasures his wife, Ginger,
4 and is father to two wonderful children: Justin, married to
5 wife Carolyne; and Christine, married to husband Wil; Senator
6 Marsh also has six grandchildren whom he loves dearly; and

7 WHEREAS, Senator Marsh's wife, Ginger, is a public
8 school educator, and his children are products of the public
9 education system; as such, Senator Marsh has championed the
10 cause of public education throughout his Senate career; one of
11 the highlights of his legislative portfolio is the Alabama
12 Accountability Act, to ensure proper use of education
13 resources and to provide for more school choice in Alabama; he
14 has continued to fight for this cause during his final days
15 serving in the Senate chamber; indeed, the State House's own
16 "honey badger" has duly earned that maverick reputation
17 through his perseverance and tenacity in advocating for his
18 legislative proposals; and

19 WHEREAS, in addition to serving ex officio on every
20 Senate committee during his tenure as President of the Senate,
21 Senator Marsh has lent his judgment and expertise to all of
22 the following Senate standing committees: the Judiciary
23 Committee; the Finance and Taxation, Education Committee; the
24 Local Legislation Committee; the Governmental Affairs
25 Committee; and the Tourism Committee, as chair, as well as the

1 former Tourism and Marketing Committee, also as chair;
2 additionally, he has served on the Permanent Joint Legislative
3 Advisory Committee on Economic Incentives; and

4 WHEREAS, for all these reasons recounted within this
5 resolution and countless more, this body will miss Senator
6 Marsh following his departure, and wishes him the best in all
7 his future endeavors; now therefore,

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
9 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That Senator Del Marsh is hereby
10 commended in the highest manner for his exemplary service to
11 the Legislature of Alabama, the State of Alabama, and all of
12 its citizens; and that a copy of this resolution be presented
13 to him as a token of our endless thanks and the immense esteem
14 in which he is regarded.
