Councill Trenholm Memorial Award 11 at the National Education Association's Annual Human and Civil 12 13 Rights Awards Dinner in 2009, in recognition of his 14 outstanding achievement in expanding educational opportunities 15 for minority students and educators and improving intergroup 16 relations in public schools; he is also the recipient of the 17 Common Cause Public Service Award, the Grand Polemark Award presented by Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, the National Builder 18

Award presented by the Black Caucus of State Legislators, and many additional awards and citations; and
