15	spans more than 10,000 years with a westward-looking future;

17	WHEREAS, Turkey is the sixth largest economy in
18	Europe; the sixteenth largest economy in the world, and is the
19	seventh most visited tourism destination in the world; and
20	WHEREAS, Turkey is a founding member of the
21	Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)
22	and the Group of Twenty (G-20); and
23	WHEREAS, the Turkish Union of Chambers of Commerce
24	and Commodity Exchanges is a leading private sector
25	organization in the global economy; Turkey has signed 16 free

1	trade agreements with several countries and the European Free
2	Trade Association, 14 of which are in effect, and is in
3	negotiations to enter into free trade agreements with several
4	other countries, including Canada, Lebanon, South Africa, and
5	Mexico; and
6	WHEREAS, United States' exports account for 6.09
7	percent of goods that enter Turkey; and
8	WHEREAS, closer relations with Turkey through free
9	trade agreements would encourage further privatization in
10	Turkey's economy and support Turkish investment in the State
11	of Alabama; and
12	WHEREAS, from 2000 to 2009, Turkey's imports posted
13	a 158 percent increase and imports from free trade agreement
14	countries increased by 118 percent; and
15	WHEREAS, enriching the economy and cultural heritage
16	of the State of Alabama, Turkey is the featured country of the
17	Birmingham International Center Spotlight Program 2010-11,
18	jointly with the Turkish American Association of Alabama and
19	Assembly of Turkish American Associations; and
20	WHEREAS, many Turkish-Alabamians and many
21	institutions such as Turkish American Chamber of Commerce
22	Southeast, Peace Valley Foundation, and Istanbul Center have
23	been organizing and sponsoring numerous events in the State of
