- 23 (c) All appointing authorities shall coordinate

 25 reflects the racial, gender, geographical, urban, rural, and

1 (d) The study commission shall meet as needed at the 2 call of the chair.

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- (e) Each member shall serve at the pleasure of his or her appointing authority. A vacancy in the membership shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
- (f) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses as follows:
- (1) The legislative members of the study commission shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the study commission, in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.
- (2) Other members of the commission may be reimbursed for necessary expenses in attending meetings of the commission according to policies and procedures of their respective appointing authority.
- (g) A majority of the members of the study commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business at a regular or special meeting.
- (h) The study commission shall hold its initial meeting no later than September 1, 2020. Each appointment made shall be indicated to the Executive Director of the Alabama Sentencing Commission no later than the first day of the third month following the Governor's signature of the resolution.
- (i) The study commission shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Senate President Pro Tempore and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on or

- 1 before the first day of the 2021 legislative session, at which
- 2 time it shall be dissolved.
