7	WHEREAS, counties in the United States routinely
8	provide treatment services to the estimated two million people
9	with serious mental illnesses who are jailed each year; and
10	WHEREAS, people in jails are three to six times more
11	likely than people in the general population to have serious
12	mental illnesses; and
13	WHEREAS, almost three-quarters of jailed adults with
14	serious mental illnesses also have substance-use disorders;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, adults with mental illnesses tend to stay
17	longer in jail and upon release are at a higher risk of
18	recidivism than people without these disorders; and
19	WHEREAS, county jails spend two to three times more
20	on adults with mental illnesses that require interventions
21	compared to adults without those treatment needs; and
22	WHEREAS, without appropriate treatment and services,
23	people with mental illnesses continue to cycle through the
24	criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes
25	for these individuals and their families; and

1	WHEREAS, adults with mental illness have three times
2	longer boarding times in hospital emergency departments; and
3	WHEREAS, hospitals incur a direct loss of
4	approximately \$1,200 per emergency room visit for people with
5	mental illness; and
6	WHEREAS, the State of Alabama takes pride in its
7	responsibility to protect and enhance the health, welfare, and
8	safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways;
9	and
10	WHEREAS, through Stepping Up, the Alabama Department
11	of Mental Health, the National Association of Counties, the
12	Council of State Governments Justice Center, and the American
13	Psychiatric Association Foundation are encouraging public,
14	private, and non-profit partners to reduce the number of
15	people with mental illnesses in jails and hospitals; now
16	therefore,
17	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
