1 SJR4 2 3 4 ENROLLED, SJR4, CELEBRATING THE LIFE AND MOURNING THE PASSING OF 5 6 FORMER ALABAMA CONGRESSMAN HERBERT LEON "SONNY" CALLAHAN, JR. 7 8 WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the 9 death of former Alabama Congressman Herbert Leon "Sonny" Callahan, Jr. of Mobile, Alabama, on June 24, 2021, at the age 10 11 of 88; his passing leaves a void in the lives of his loving 12 family, many friends, and the entire community and state, 13 where he was highly regarded; and 14 WHEREAS, a native and lifelong resident of Mobile, 15 Alabama, Congressman Callahan was born on September 11, 1932, 16 to Herbert Leon Callahan and Fan Callahan; he was born into a 17 large Irish Catholic family, having eight brothers and sisters; he graduated from McGill Institute in 1950 and 18 19 attended the University of South Alabama before serving in the 20 United States Navy; upon returning to Mobile, Congressman 21 Callahan began a successful career in the trucking and 22 warehouse business; he was elected to the Alabama House of 23 Representatives in 1971 where he served until he was elected 24 to the Alabama State Senate in 1979; in 1984, Congressman 25 Callahan was elected to the United States House of

1 Representatives where he faithfully served Alabama's First 2 Congressional District for 18 years before retiring in 2003; 3 in the United States Congress, he served as Chairman of two 4 Appropriations Subcommittees, Foreign Operations and Energy 5 and Water; upon retiring from Congress, he continued to work 6 in Washington, D.C., for 17 years after founding a lobbying 7 firm, Sonny Callahan and Associates; and

WHEREAS, he was one of south Alabama's most beloved 8 9 and accessible public servants; his commonsense approach to 10 resolving issues and his uncanny ability to know which battles 11 where worth the fight served him well in his political roles; one of his most endearing qualities was to lighten a tense 12 situation with humor and to tackle controversial issues with 13 14 simplicity, grace, and humility; Congressman Callahan was 15 popular on both sides of the political aisle and had a unique 16 ability to relate to people from all walks of life; and

WHEREAS, Congressman Callahan was preceded in death
by his parents; son, Cameron R. Callahan; brothers, Charles
Callahan and Terry Callahan; and sisters, Mary Jane Emmick,
Rosie Smitherman, Margaret Ann Athey, and Patsy Dunnavant; and
WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife of 52 years,

Karen Reed Callahan; children, H. Scott Callahan (Jacqui),
Patrick M. Callahan, Shawn M. Cushing (Dan), Christopher A.
Callahan (Amanda), and Kelly L. Thomas (Mark); brother, George

Callahan; sister, Sissy Martin; numerous grandchildren; and a
 host of other relatives and many friends; and

3 WHEREAS, Congressman Callahan was a dedicated public 4 servant whose contributions were far-reaching and innumerable; 5 although his presence will be missed, his legacy will endure, 6 and his memory will be cherished in the hearts and minds of 7 all who were privileged to know him during his lifetime; now 8 therefore,

9 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 10 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the death of former Alabama 11 Congressman Herbert Leon "Sonny" Callahan, Jr. is recorded 12 with deep sadness, and this resolution is offered in tribute 13 to his life and with heartfelt sympathy to his family.
