7	WHEREAS, with profound sorrow and regret, we receive
8	news of the death of Mr. Jack Allen of Decatur, Alabama, on
9	December 25, 2015, at the age of 84 years; and
10	WHEREAS, the passing of Mr. Allen leaves a void in
11	the lives of his loving family, his many friends, and the
12	entire community, where he was well-known and highly regarded;

14	WHEREAS, Mr. Allen was born June 11, 1931, in
15	Austinville, Alabama, to William O. and Inez Sparkman Allen;
16	he was a 1949 graduate of Austinville High School, where he
17	played basketball and earned a scholarship to the University
18	of North Alabama, formerly Florence State Teachers College;
19	and
20	WHEREAS, his passion for basketball led him to
21	become an Alabama High School Athletic Association Basketball
22	Official, still serving as an official observer until the time
23	of his passing; in addition he served his beloved country in
24	the United States 32nd Infantry Regiment in Korea, and after

fulfilling his military service he dedicated 20 years of his

life to the City of Decatur's youth as a Dixie Youth Baseball Coach, earning him a place in the 1992 Morgan County Sports Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, his service to his community continued when, in 1976, he was elected to a seat on the Decatur City Council, a position he was elected to for six consecutive four-year terms, totalling 24 years; one of the highest honors bestowed upon him was the unexpected naming of The Jack Allen Recreation and Soccer Complex; and

WHEREAS, his grandfather, Asbury Sparkman, was the City Clerk of Austinville, from whom he learned at a young age the importance of service to his community; he would attend church with his grandfather at Austinville Methodist Church, where the Christian principles instilled in him there were carried with him throughout the rest of his life; his favorite scripture was Philippians 4:13, and he would say that he would do anything that was asked of him because he believed the responsibility was a calling of God, often saying "I'll give it my best shot"; during his retirement, he began another career in the insurance business and enjoyed cleaning up his motor home to travel to Alabama football games; and

WHEREAS, preceding him in death were his parents, two brothers, William O. Allen, Jr., and Tommy Allen, two sisters, Mary Allen Davis and Irene Allen Hayes; and

1	WHEREAS, he is survived by his loving wife of 61
2	years, Betty Allen; his son, Stuart (Roslyn) Allen; his
3	daughter, Beth Allen; his grandsons, Parker Allen and Hunter
4	Allen; one sister, Becky McIntyre; and several nieces,
5	nephews, and cousins; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Allen was a valued member of the community; although his presence will be missed, his memory will be cherished in the hearts and minds of those who were fortunate to know him; now therefore,
