songs; as the legend says, you only have to listen; now therefore,

3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 4 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we officially designate the 5 bridge crossing the Tennessee River in the Muscle Shoals area, currently referred to as the Patton Island Bridge, the 6 7 "Singing River Bridge," and request the appropriate officials 8 to erect and maintain appropriate signs designating the bridge 9 and recognizing the legends of the Native American people who 10 were the first inhabitants of the area.
