14	Americans, often singing songs to them; and
15	WHEREAS, the Yuchi people, who most anthropologists
16	believe were the first people of language in North America,
17	referred to the Tennessee River as nun-nuh-sae, which means
18	"The River that Sings"; and before the dams were built,
19	especially during periods of flooding, one could hear the
20	river from the town of Florence; and
21	WHEREAS, the great dams have softened the sound, but
22	if you go to a quiet place and listen you can still hear her
23	songs; as the legend says, you only have to listen; now
24	therefore,

1	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
2	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we officially designate the
3	bridge crossing the Tennessee River in the Muscle Shoals area,
4	currently referred to as the Patton Island Bridge, the
5	"Singing River Bridge," and request the appropriate officials
6	to erect and maintain appropriate signs designating the bridge
7	and recognizing the legends of the Native American people who
8	were the first inhabitants of the area.
