1 Enrolled, An Act, 2 3 4 SJR CELEBRATING THE 140TH ANNIVERSARY OF PROVIDENCE 5 BAPTIST CHURCH. 6 7 WHEREAS, highest commendations and congratulations 8 are herein proudly presented to Providence Baptist Church on the momentous occasion of its 140th Anniversary; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Providence Baptist Church, located South of Opelika in the Community of Beauregard, was organized in 11 12 1884 and became affiliated with the Tuskegee Baptist 13 Association, now the Tuskegee-Lee Baptist Association, in 1904; and 14 15 WHEREAS, in its 140-year history, generations of Providence families have watched the church grow from a 16 17 one-room, wooden-frame structure, to a larger concrete block 18 building in 1948, to the present facility which includes the 19 sanctuary building built in 1965 and a children's education building built in 1973; the church acquired 41 acres of land 20 21 across the street from the original church and voted in 22 January 2001 to build the "West Campus"; and WHEREAS, the congregation of Providence Baptist 23 24 Church has grown to over 1,700 members who continue to hold 25 to the original, deep Christian commitment to give 26 generously to help the church grow and thrive; leading the 27 way as a mission-minded church, a percentage of the congregation's tithes and offerings goes for support of The 28

29 Cooperative Program, Association Missions, World Hunger, The 30 Children's Homes, Annuity for Retired Pastors, and Home 31 Mission Field, along with many other benevolent ministries; 32 and

33 WHEREAS, the Sunday School organization started in 34 1930 and was promoted by Mrs. Mary Mayberry out of concern 35 for the teaching of scripture to children in the community; 36 Bible study and its application to life continue to be an 37 important part of Providence Baptist Church; and

38 WHEREAS, church records from 1904 indicate that 21 39 pastors have been called to lead the congregation; 40 Missionary Pastor D.S. Duffee is the first pastor on record 41 as reported by the Alabama Baptist Historical Commission; 42 and

43 WHEREAS, Dr. Rusty J. Sowell was called in April of 1984 to lead the congregation, and he has faithfully served 44 45 as pastor for the past 40 years; Dr. Thomas R. Smith, has 46 served as the Minister of Music since 1974, and Reverend 47 Chuck Adams has served as the Minister to Students and Associate Pastor since 2004; together they have a combined 48 49 total of 110 years of leading, challenging, and inspiring 50 the Providence Baptist Church congregation; and

51 WHEREAS, a remarkable congregation, Providence 52 Baptist Church has been passionately sharing the Word and 53 love of God, transforming lives, and bringing people 54 together in fellowship and worship for 140 years; and 55 WHEREAS, today, as in the beginning, this community 56 of faith continues to believe and profess that their best
