4	SJR EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR OFFSHORE OIL AND NATURAL GAS
5	LEASING AND DEVELOPMENT.
6	
7	WHEREAS, the purpose of this resolution is to
8	strongly urge the President of the United States to consider
9	the importance of maintaining a strong U.S. offshore oil and
10	natural gas industry and support policies and take measures
11	to ensure America's long-term energy affordability,
12	security, and leadership, including actions that result in
13	the continued development of our nation's offshore oil and
14	natural gas resources, including those off the shores of
15	Alabama; and
16	WHEREAS, offshore oil and natural gas are vital
17	components of our nation's economy, providing more than 15
18	percent of U.S. supplies, supporting over 300,000 jobs, and
19	contributing four to five billion dollars to federal and
20	state treasuries each year; and
21	WHEREAS, U.S. energy abundance has historically
22	contributed to the availability of reliable, affordable
23	energy and increased energy security for the U.S. and its
24	allies; and
25	WHEREAS, U.S. citizens depend on natural gas to
26	produce electricity, including the State of Alabama which
27	generates 37 percent of its electricity from natural gas;

29	WHEREAS, the world continues to look to America for
30	energy leadership, stability, and technological innovation,
31	particularly in deep water offshore exploration and
32	development; and
33	WHEREAS, the State of Alabama, in accordance with the
34	Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act of 2006, has received a
35	total of \$188,500,000 in royalties since 2009, receiving
36	\$34,800,000 in 2022; and
37	WHEREAS, U.S. offshore production is the main funding
38	source for the Land and Water Conservation Fund that
39	provides billions in revenues to federal, state, and local
40	governments to support conservation programs, including
41	\$163,000,000 to Alabama over the past five decades to
42	protect many of the state's various preserves and forests;
43	and
44	WHEREAS, every U.S. state has businesses and jobs
45	that are part of the U.S. offshore oil and natural gas
46	supply and vendor chain; and
47	WHEREAS, the President has yet to finalize a program
48	for future offshore oil and natural gas leasing in federal
49	waters or start the Multi-sale Environmental Impact Analysis
50	needed for lease sales to be held in 2024; and
51	WHEREAS, U.S. offshore production is one of the
52	lowest carbon intensive energy-producing regions in the
53	world, and halting offshore leasing and development will
54	shift production and capital investment overseas and
55	undermine decades of environmental progress: now therefore:



56	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
57	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we, the members of the
58	Alabama Legislature, strongly urge the President of the
59	United States to enact policies that will result in
60	continued long-term American energy leadership, security,
61	and progress, including promptly initiating the Multi-sale
62	Environmental Impact Analysis and quickly issuing a robust
63	five-year offshore oil and natural gas leasing program that
64	will allow lease sales to continue in 2024 and beyond.
65	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State
66	send duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the
67	President of the United States, the United States Secretary
68	of the Interior, the United States Secretary of
69	Transportation, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission,
70	and the Alabama Congressional delegation.
