8	COMMENDING TAIWAN FOR ITS RELATIONS WITH THE UNITED
9	STATES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

11	WHEREAS, in the year of 2012, Taiwan held its fifth
12	direct presidential election and again demonstrated the
13	strength and vitality of its democratic system, paving the way
14	for Taiwan as a beacon of democracy in Asia and beyond; and
15	WHEREAS, under President Ma Ying-jeou's
16	administration, Taiwan has committed to achieving peace and
17	co-prosperity with mainland China since 2008, and serves the
18	best interests of the Asia-Pacific region in the continuation
19	of stability and growth; and
20	WHEREAS, Taiwan and the United States are
21	long-standing allies who both deeply cherish the common values
22	of freedom, democracy, human rights, and the rule of law; and
23	WHEREAS, the State of Alabama and Taiwan have
24	enjoyed long, cordial, and mutually beneficial sister-state
25	relations since 1983, a friendship that continues to
26	strengthen with each passing year; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan is the United States' tenth-largest trading partner, and the United States is Taiwan's third-largest trading partner; and

WHEREAS, with the designation of Taiwan into the United States' Visa Waiver Program taking effect in November of 2012, Taiwan passport holders may now visit the United States for business or tourism for stays up to 90 days without obtaining a visa, which is a significant step to draw travelers from Taiwan choosing the United States as their destination for trade, investment, and sightseeing; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan is an active member in the international community with a long history of commitment to international health and humanitarian aid as well as environmental protection; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the members of this body commend and support the democratization efforts of Taiwan and the nation's meaningful participation in the World Health Organization, the International Civil Aviation Organization, and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, as well as other international organizations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this body welcomes all opportunities for an even closer economic partnership with Taiwan, such as the signing of a United States-Taiwan Bilateral Investment Agreement and a Free Trade Agreement, and the inclusion of Taiwan in the Trans-Pacific Partnership, to enhance the special 30th anniversary sister-state bond between

Alabama and Taiwan, and encourages further cultural,
educational, and business exchanges between the citizens of
Alabama and Taiwan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That an appropriate copy of
this resolution be transmitted to Ms. Anna A. Kao, Director
General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Atlanta,
Georgia.
