1 171915-1:n:09/10/2015:MCS/agb LRS2015-2905 2 3 4 5 6 7 CREATING THE ALABAMA BLUE RIBBON BIPARTISAN JUVENILE 8 JUSTICE REFORM TASK FORCE. 9 10 WHEREAS, Act 2015-276 of the 2015 Regular Session 11 12 (SJR43) created the Alabama Prison Task Force to study and 13 recommend legislative solutions for a broad range of issues 14 related to prison inmate over population, however the scope of 15 the Prison Task Force does not include a study of issues 16 specifically relating to juvenile justice reform; now 17 therefore, 18 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is created the Alabama 19 20 Blue Ribbon Bipartisan Juvenile Justice Reform Task Force to 21 be comprised of the following members: 22 (1) The Chair of the Senate Committee on Judiciary. 23 (2) Two members of the Senate appointed by the Chair 24 of the Senate Committee on Judiciary. 25 (3) Two nonlegislative members appointed by the 26 Chair of the Senate Committee on Judiciary.

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(4) The Chair of the House Judiciary Committee.

2 (5) Two members of the House of Representatives
3 appointed by the Chair of the House Judiciary Committee.

4 (6) Two nonlegislative members appointed by the
5 Chair of the House Committee on Judiciary.

6 The task force membership shall be inclusive and 7 shall reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, 8 and economic diversity of the state.

9 The Chair of the Senate Committee on Judiciary shall 10 call the first meeting of the task force. At the first 11 meeting, the members shall select a chair to preside over 12 meetings of the task force, and a vice chair to serve in the 13 absence of the chair. Thereafter the task force shall meet 14 upon the call of the chair, or by a majority vote of the 15 membership of the task force.

16 The task force shall study and identify causes and 17 potential legislative solutions relating to the incarceration 18 of juveniles in this state.

19 The task force shall study a broad range of issues 20 related to juvenile incarceration including, but not limited 21 to: Juvenile court procedures and sentencing; data on reported 22 crimes and arrests; problem-solving suggestions and policies 23 of the courts; felony and parole policies; juvenile admissions 24 and length of stay; community center programs; recidivism 25 rates; and alternative drug court sentencing. 1

The task force shall report its findings,

2 conclusions, and recommendations for proposed legislation to 3 the Permanent Joint Legislative Prison Committee no later than 4 the 15th day of the 2016 Regular Session, where upon it shall 5 stand dissolved and discharged of any further duties.

Each nonlegislative member of the task force may be reimbursed for expenses related to attending meetings consistent with the policies of the various appointing authorities.

Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the 10 11 Senate and Clerk of the House of Representatives shall provide 12 necessary clerical assistance for the work of the task force. Each legislative member of the task force shall be entitled to 13 14 his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and 15 travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of 16 the task force in accordance with Amendment 871 of the 17 Constitution of Alabama of 1901. These payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature by 18 means of warrants drawn by the state Comptroller on the State 19 20 Treasury.
