(e) The following articles shall be excluded from 9 10 consideration by the commission due to a previous revision of 11 the article or because revision is not considered needed: 12 (1) Article II, State Boundaries, which are 13 determined by Congress. 14 (2) Article VI, Judicial Article, which was revised 15 in 1973. 16 (3) Article VIII, Suffrage and Elections, which was revised in 1996. 17 18 (4) Article XV, Militia. 19 (5) Article XVI, Oath of Office. (6) Article XVIII, Mode of Amending the 20 21 Constitution. 22 (f) Article XI Taxation is excluded from the 23 consideration by the commission at this time and not subject 24 to the timetable established by this resolution.

1 (g) The commission shall be charged with the following duties and responsibilities: 2 3 (1) Create a public awareness of and educate the 4 public on the changes recommended. (2) Provide the Legislature with recommendations for 5 any changes to the article under consideration. 6 (3) Report its findings, conclusions, 7 8 recommendations, and suggestions to each article to be considered in each House of the Legislature by the third 9 legislative day of each year after 2011. 10 11 (h) The membership of the commission shall be 12 inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, 13 urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.
