10	Regional In-service Centers (ARIC), the host universities, and
11	the local school districts are functioning as a true
12	partnership; and
13	WHEREAS, it is the intent of all concerned to
14	maintain a high level of integrity, effectiveness, and
15	enthusiasm for all stakeholders and to assure that the
16	programs and initiatives provided through all the ARIC
17	programs are of highest quality; and
18	WHEREAS, it is the desire of all concerned to
19	enhance and assure the confidences in the ALSDE, the ARIC, the
20	presently established ARIC governing boards, the host
21	universities, and the local school districts; and
22	WHEREAS, it is well understood that the
23	effectiveness and accountability of any program or initiative
24	should involve all stakeholders by working cooperatively in
25	the decision making processes; and

1	WHEREAS, there have been several discussions
2	concerning the accountability of programs and initiatives by
3	all stakeholders; now therefore,
4	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
5	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the ARIC Accountability
6	Standards Committee, as authorized by the Alabama Legislature
7	in Act 87-714, is created to revise the existing ARIC
8	Accountability Standards. The committee is chaired by the
9	director and principal investigator of the program of The
10	University of North Alabama.
11	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the ARIC Accountability
12	Standards Committee is authorized by the Alabama Legislature
13	to establish Accountability Standards for the Alabama Science
14	in Motion (ASIM) and for the Alabama Math, Science, and
15	Technology Initiative (AMSTI).
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That members of the ARIC
17	Accountability Standards Committee shall be as follows:
18	(1) One member of the Senate, appointed by the
19	President Pro Tempore.
20	(2) Two members of the House of Representatives,
21	appointed by the Speaker.
22	(3) A former member of the South Alabama Research
23	and Inservice Center, appointed by the Governor.
24	(4) Three members of the State Board of Education,
25	appointed by the board.

1	(5) Three Directors of the ARIC.
2	(6) Four members appointed by the State Department
3	of Education.
4	(7) Eight members appointed by the ARIC Governing
5	Board Members, to include two superintendents and six
6	classroom teachers.
7	(8) One member appointed by the Alabama Education
8	Association Member.
9	(9) One member appointed by the Alabama School Board
10	Association.
11	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the appointing
12	authorities shall coordinate their appointments to assure
13	committee membership is inclusive and reflects the racial,
14	gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of
15	the state.
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the AISM Accountability
17	Standards Committee shall include the ARIC Accountability
18	Standards Committee in addition to three ASIM specialists and
19	three ASIM classroom teachers.
20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the AMSTI
21	Accountability Standards Committee shall include the ARIC
22	Accountability Standards Committee in addition to three AMSTI
23	directors, three AMSTI specialists, and three AMSTI classroom

teachers.
