2 3 4 5 6 7 8 CREATING THE ALABAMA DUI PREVENTION AND IGNITION 9 INTERLOCK ADVISORY COUNCIL.

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11 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 12 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is hereby created the 13 Alabama DUI Prevention and Ignition Interlock Advisory 14 Council. The primary purpose of the advisory council shall be 15 to identify successful methods and strategies to reduce the number of individuals driving under the influence and, in 16 17 turn, alcohol-related fatalities in this state. To accomplish this purpose, the advisory council shall conduct an in-depth 18 analysis of pertinent laws, rules, and regulations in this 19 state relating to driving under the influence and ignition 20 21 interlocks and provide suggested modifications to enhance 22 these laws, rules, and regulations.

The members of the advisory council shall include the following: A member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; a member of the House of Representatives with a law enforcement background appointed by the Speaker Pro Tempore of the House

1 of Representatives; a member of the Senate appointed by the 2 Senate President Pro Tempore; a member of the Senate with a legal background appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; a 3 4 member appointed by the Governor; the Chair of the House Public Safety and Homeland Security Committee, or his or her 5 6 designee from the committee; the Chair of the Senate Judiciary 7 Committee, or his or her designee from the committee; the Director of the Administrative Office of Courts, or his or her 8 9 designee; the Director of the Department of Public Safety, or 10 his or her designee; the Chief of the Department of Public Safety Drivers License Division, or his or her designee; the 11 12 Director of the Department of Forensic Sciences, or his or her 13 designee; the Office of Prosecution Services Traffic Safety 14 Resource Prosecutor, or his or her designee; the President of 15 the Alabama Circuit Judges Association, or his or her designee; the Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health, 16 17 or his or her designee; a member appointed by the Court Referral Officer Association of Alabama; a member appointed by 18 Mothers Against Drunk Driving Alabama; the Chief of the Law 19 Enforcement and Traffic Division of ADECA, or his or her 20 21 designee; a member appointed by the Alabama Criminal Defense 22 Lawyers Association; the President of the Alabama Association 23 of Chiefs of Police, or his or her designee; the President of the Alabama Sheriffs' Association, or his or her designee; and 24 25 a member appointed from each approved ignition interlock 26 provider according to the Department of Forensic Sciences. The membership of the advisory council shall be inclusive and 27

reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and
economic diversity of the state.

The first meeting of the advisory council shall be 3 4 held within 180 days of the effective date of this act. The advisory council shall elect a chair from its membership at 5 its first meeting and shall hold, at a minimum, one annual 6 7 meeting. The chair shall schedule additional meetings as he or she deems necessary. The council may hold public meetings as 8 necessary for the purpose of receiving input from the public 9 10 relating to the effectiveness of current driving under the influence and ignition interlock laws, rules, and regulations. 11

12 All meetings of the advisory council shall be open 13 to the public. All findings, conclusions, and recommendations 14 for improvement of current driving under the influence laws, 15 rules, and regulations, if any, of the advisory council shall 16 be reported to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the 17 Speaker of the House of Representatives. The report shall also 18 be made available to the public.

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
