9	ACCEPTING FEDERAL FUNDS TIED TO THE COMMON CORE STATE

13	WHEREAS, on November 18, 2010, the State Board of
14	Education adopted the Common Core State Standards Initiative
15	defining the knowledge and skills students should have
16	received during their K-12 education careers; and
17	WHEREAS, the United States Constitution wisely
18	leaves the setting of academic standards, curriculum, and
19	instruction to the states, and the State Board of Education is
20	charged with the general control and supervision of public
21	education in Alabama and the establishment of Alabama's
22	courses of study which contain Alabama's educational standards
23	by subject matter; and
24	WHEREAS, the debate over who decides these
25	educational standards is of critical importance to every
26	Alabama family and is determinative of the future prosperity
27	of this state; and

WHEREAS, blatantly contrary to Federalism and state autonomy, the federal government has intruded upon Alabama's right to establish educational curriculum and standards and the powers duly delegated to the board to do so, thereby denying this state its rightful duty to determine what curriculum and standards are best suited to promote the education of the children in our state; and

WHEREAS, given the absence of political will to fully and openly debate this issue in the Alabama Legislature, the duties of elected representatives of this state to make important decisions relating to the educational standards for our children are ceded to bureaucrats in Washington; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we urge the State Board of Education to take all steps necessary to refrain from accepting any federal funds tied to the Common Core State Standards Initiative until a full and open debate of this issue has occurred in the Alabama Legislature to ensure that the State of Alabama retains complete control over its academic standards, curriculum, instruction, and testing system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be provided to the State Superintendant of Education for distribution to the board.
