WHEREAS, Alabama coal communities have been hit extremely hard by the loss of coal jobs and with our healthy and willing workers fleeing for better horizons, leaving behind only our growing older population; our communities are in economic trouble because of a lack of coal production; and WHEREAS, closed coal companies not only cost coal miners their jobs, but also job-related industries on the local level have been victimized by the loss of coal mining 

miners their jobs, but also job-related industries on the local level have been victimized by the loss of coal mining jobs; similarly, small businesses, dependent on people working directly and indirectly with the coal industry, are out of business and the worst may be yet to come; with the lack of taxes derived from coal and coal-related businesses, it will be a matter of time before countless citizens of Alabama are faced with severe economic hardship; and

WHEREAS, the Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC), an agency of the federal government, has announced the availability of additional funds for grants under the

Partnerships for Opportunity and Workforce and Economic
Revitalization (POWER) Initiative, which is an integrated,
multi-agency effort to align and invest federal economic and
workforce development resources in communities and regions
negatively impacted by changes in the coal economy; and

WHEREAS, in order for Alabama coal communities and regions to diversify their local and regional economies successfully, the POWER Program will establish priorities, designating federal resources to projects and activities that will produces multiple economic development outcomes, such as promoting regional economic growth and diversification, new job creation, reemployment opportunities for displaced coal economy workers, including those that are specifically identified under local and regional economic plans that have been collaboratively produced by diverse local and regional stakeholders; the Alabama Department of Economic Affairs is the state coordinating agency tasked with facilitating the federal ARC-POWER initiative in Alabama; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That, to expedite the Alabama ARC-POWER initiative, there is created a Senate Task Force on the Transition of Alabama Unemployed Coal Miners.

- (a) The membership of the task force shall consist of Senator Greg Reed, Senator Gerald Allen, and Senator Priscilla Dunn.
- (b) The task force shall organize local communities and regional stakeholders to implement and maximize programs

and plans for transitioning unemployed workers to becoming employed workers. The task force shall focus on the situation in individual communities, coal regions, barriers affecting employment, and assets to facilitate employment. The task force shall develop a mission assessment, statement, and a plan that outlines transitioning unemployed to employed workers and that involves collaboration of local people, local organizations, institutions, small businesses, industries, and contributors.

- (c) The primary objective of the task force is to maximize projects that address economic diversification, job creation, capital investment, new skills training, and reemployment opportunities. The task force shall also review local community needs and regional infrastructure for needed design and engineering projects.
- (d) Upon becoming operational, the task force shall encourage other members of the Legislature to participate and become involved with the task force.
- (e) The long-term success of employing the displaced coal workers will require the involvement of other Alabama counties, cities, and ARC member state organizations, and, with support from the leadership of other members of the Legislature, the task force can be expanded to include multiple communities within a county, multiple counties within a region, multiple regions within a state, and multiple regions in two or more states.
