WHEREAS, Dr. Anderson devoted her life to improving the environment and her community; she was the founder and President of the Village Creek Human and Environmental Justice Society Inc., which addresses the extensive flooding of the Village Creek watershed; she was a faithful and an active member of St. Marks Episcopal Church, where she served in many capacities; and

WHEREAS, she was preceded in death by her parents and her husband, Furman C. Anderson; survivors include her children, Alameta Anderson Zinnerman (Alex) and Joseph C. Anderson (Lena); and a host of other relatives and many friends; although her presence will be greatly missed, the memory of her will be cherished in the hearts of all who knew and loved her; now therefore,
