3	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
4	14-43-320. Chief of police.		
5	(a)(1) The chief of police shall be elected by the qualified electors		
6	of the municipality in the same manner as other municipal officials are		
7	elected.		
8	(2) At the November 2022 general election and each four (4)		
9	years thereafter, the qualified electors of each municipality under this		
10	section shall elect a chief of police to take office on the next following		
11	January 1 to serve for a term of four (4) years.		
12	(b) A person elected as chief of police under this section shall		
13	perform such duties, possess such qualifications, employ such staff, and be		
14	paid such salary and expenses as may be established by ordinance of the		
15	governing body of the municipality.		
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17	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 14-44-111 is amended to read as follows:		
18	14-44-111. Election or appointment of marshal.		
19	The city marshal of cities of the second class shall be elected by the		
20	voters as provided by law. However, the city council of any such city, if th		
21	council deems it to be in the best interests of the city, and upon passage of		
22	an ordinance by the majority of the council, may provide that the marshal		
23	shall be appointed or removed by the mayor unless the council shall vote by		
24	two-thirds majority of the total membership of the council to override the		
25	mayor's action.		
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
