12 (4) A report of the amounts billed versus the total reimbursements for
 13 services rendered.

14 (5) Total miles claimed by Patient Care Providers and the total amounts

16 (d) All compensation to intermittent Patient Care Providers shall be made
 17 from the appropriation for Professional Fees and Services.

18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~
 19 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

 21 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HEALTHCARE
 23 INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM AND ARKANSAS HEALTH INSURANCE MARKETPLACE RESTRICTIONS.

24 (a) As used in this section, "Health Care Independence Program" means
 25 the Health Care Independence Program established under the Health Care
 26 Independence Act of 2014, Arkansas Code § 20-77-2401 et seq.

27 (b)(1) Determining the maximum number of employees, the maximum amount
 28 of appropriation, for what purposes an appropriation is authorized, and
 29 general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the
 30 prerogative of the General Assembly.

31 (2) The purposes of subdivision (b)(1) of this section are
 32 typically accomplished by:

33 (A) Identifying the purpose in the appropriation act;

34 (B) Delineating such maximums in the appropriation act for
 35 a state agency; and

36 (C) Delineating the general revenue allocations authorized

1 for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization Law,
2 Arkansas Code § 19-5-101 et seq.

3 (3) It is both necessary and appropriate that the General
4 Assembly restrict the use of appropriations authorized in this act.

5 (c)(1) Except as provided in this subsection, the Department of Health
6 shall not allocate, budget, expend, or utilize any appropriation authorized
7 by the General Assembly for the purpose of advertisement, promotion, or other
8 activities designed to promote or encourage enrollment in the Arkansas Health
9 Insurance Marketplace or the Health Care Independence Program, including
10 without limitation:

11 (A) Unsolicited communications mailed to potential
12 recipients;

13 (B) Television, radio, or online commercials;

14 (C) Billboard or mobile billboard advertising;

15 (D) Advertisements printed in newspapers, magazines, or
16 other print media; and

17 (E) Internet websites and electronic media.

18 (2) This subsection does not prohibit the department from:

19 (A) Direct communications with:

20 (i) Licensed insurance agents; and

21 (ii) Persons licensed by the department;

22 (B) Solicited communications with potential recipients;

23 (C)(i) Responding to an inquiry regarding the coverage for
24 which a potential recipient might be eligible, including without limitation
25 providing educational materials or information regarding any coverage for
26 which the individual might qualify.

27 (ii) Educational materials and information
28 distributed under subdivision (c)(2)(C)(i) of this section shall contain only
29 factual information and shall not contain subjective statements regarding the
30 coverage for which the potential recipient might be eligible; and

31 (D) Using an Internet website for the exclusive purpose of
32 enrolling individuals in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace or the
33 Health Care Independence Program.

34 (d) The Department of Health shall not apply for or accept any funds,
35 including without limitation federal funds, for the purpose of advertisement,
36 promotion, or other activities designed to promote or encourage enrollment in

1 the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace or the Health Care Independence
2 Program.

3 (e)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (e)(2) of this section, the
4 Department of Health shall not:

5 (A)(i) Except as provided in subdivision (e)(1)(A)(ii) of
6 this section, allocate, budget, expend, or utilize an appropriation
7 authorized by the General Assembly for the purpose of funding activities of
8 navigators, guides, certified application counselors, and certified licensed
9 producers under the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Navigator, Guide,
10 and Certified Application Counselors Act, Arkansas Code § 23-64-601 et seq.

11 (ii) Subdivision (e)(1)(A)(i) of this section does
12 not apply to regulatory and training responsibilities related to navigators,
13 guides, certified application counselors, and certified licensed producers;
14 and

15 (B) Apply for or accept any funds, including without
16 limitation federal funds, for the purpose of funding activities of
17 navigators, guides, certified application counselors, and certified licensed
18 producers under the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Navigator, Guide,
19 and Certified Application Counselors Act, Arkansas Code § 23-64-601 et seq.

20 (2) Subdivision (e)(1) of this section does not apply to
21 certified application counselors at health related institutions, including
22 without limitation the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

23 (f) An appropriation authorized by the General Assembly shall not be
24 subject to the provisions allowed through reallocation of resources or
25 transfer of appropriation authority for the purpose of transferring an
26 appropriation to any other appropriation authorized for the Department of
27 Health to be allocated, budgeted, expended, or utilized in a manner
28 prohibited by this section.

29 (g) The provisions of this section are severable, and the invalidity
30 of any subsection or subdivision of this section shall not affect other
31 provisions of the section that can be given effect without the invalid
32 provision.

33 (h) This section expires on June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

34
35 SECTION 29. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
36 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency

1 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
2 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
3 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
4 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
5 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
6 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
7 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

8
9 SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
10 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
11 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
12 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
13 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
14 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
15 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
16 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

17
18 SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
19 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
20 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
21 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2016 is essential to the operation of
22 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
23 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
24 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2016 could work irreparable harm
25 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
26 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
27 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
28 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2016.
