29	(a) The Arkansas State Board of Nursing may grant a certificate of			
30	prescriptive authority to an advanced practice registered nurse who:			
31	(1) Submi	its proof of successful completion o	of an Arkansas State	
32	Board of Nursing-approved advanced pharmacology course that shall include			
33	preceptorial experience in the prescription of drugs, medicines, and			
34	therapeutic devices; and

36	<u>(A)</u>	Has a collaborative practice agree	ement with a	

1 practicing physician who is licensed under the Arkansas Medical Practices 2 Act, $\S 17-95-201$ et seq., $\S 17-95-301$ et seq., and $\S 17-95-401$ et seq., and 3 who has training in scope, specialty, or expertise to that of the advanced 4 practice registered nurse on file with the Arkansas State Board of Nursing; 5 (B) Completes a one-year nursing program, approved by the 6 Arkansas State Board of Nursing, in conjunction with: 7 (i) A physician; or 8 (ii) An advanced practice registered nurse who has three (3) or more years of practice and a certificate of prescriptive 9 10 authority in good standing with the Arkansas State Board of Nursing; or 11 (C) Either holds: 12 (i) A certificate of prescriptive authority issued by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing for three (3) years or more and is in 13 14 good standing with the Arkansas State Board of Nursing; or 15 (ii) If the state laws regarding prescriptive 16 authority are substantially similar to or more strict than the laws of 17 Arkansas pertaining to prescriptive authority, as determined by the Arkansas 18 State Board of Nursing, an advanced practice nursing license with 19 prescriptive authority in another state or an advanced practice nursing 20 license with a certificate of prescriptive authority in another state, for three (3) years or more and is in good standing with the respective state 21 22 board or licensing authority; and 23 (3) Completes education hours and continuing education hours as 24 required by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing. 25 (b)(1) An advanced practice registered nurse with a certificate of prescriptive authority may receive and prescribe drugs, medicines, or 26 27 therapeutic devices appropriate to the advanced practice registered nurse's 28 area of practice in accordance with rules established by the Arkansas State 29 Board of Nursing. 30 (2) An advanced practice registered nurse's prescriptive 31 authority shall extend only to drugs listed in Schedules III - V and, if 32 expressly authorized by the collaborative practice agreement, also to those hydrocodone combination products reclassified from Schedule III to Schedule 33 II as of October 6, 2014 to drugs listed in Schedules II - V. 34 35 (3)(A) The Arkansas State Board of Nursing shall promptly adopt 36 rules applicable to an advance advanced practice registered nurse that are

- l consistent with the Arkansas State Medical Board's rules governing the
- 2 prescription of dangerous drugs and controlled substances.
- 3 (B) Prior to Before approval of the Arkansas State Board
- 4 of Nursing's rules, the Arkansas State Medical Board shall review the
- 5 proposed rules and verify that the proposed rules are consistent with the
- 6 Arkansas State Medical Board's rules concerning the prescription of dangerous
- 7 drugs and controlled substances.
- 8 (c) A collaborative practice agreement shall include, but not be
- 9 limited to, provisions addressing:
- 10 (1) The availability of the collaborating physician for
- 11 consultation or referral, or both;
- 12 (2) Methods of management of the collaborative practice, which
- 13 shall include protocols for prescriptive authority;
- 14 (3) Coverage of the healthcare needs of a patient in the
- 15 emergency absence of the advanced practice registered nurse or physician; and
- 16 (4) Quality assurance.
- 17 (d) If a collaborative practice results in complaints of violations of
- 18 the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, § 17-95-201 et seq., § 17-95-301 et seq.,
- 19 and § 17-95-401 et seq., the Arkansas State Medical Board may review the role
- 20 of the physician in the collaborative practice to determine if the physician
- 21 is unable to manage his or her responsibilities under the agreement without
- 22 an adverse effect on the quality of care of the patient.
- 23 (e) If a collaborative practice results in complaints of violations of
- 24 this chapter, the Arkansas State Board of Nursing may review the role of the
- 25 advanced practice registered nurse in the collaborative practice to determine
- 26 if the nurse is unable to manage his or her responsibilities under the
- 27 agreement without an adverse effect on the quality of care of the patient.
