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1 than two hundred fifty (250) continuing education hours as approved by the 2 board: 3 (ii) On or after July 1, 2010, has been an active 4 and practicing licensee and registered as a master massage therapist for a 5 period of not less than three (3) years preceding the application for an 6 upgrade to massage therapy instructor; 7 (iii) On or after July 1, 2010, in addition to the 8 experience under subdivision (6)(A)(i) of this section, has completed no 9 fewer less than two hundred fifty (250) continuing education hours as 10 approved by the board as a licensed master massage therapist; and 11 (iv) Is determined by the board to be qualified to 12 be licensed and registered to practice massage therapy. 13 (B) "Massage therapy instructor" includes a person who has 14 previously obtained the massage therapy instructor license under prior state 15 law. 16 (C) Massage therapy instructors may: 17 Instruct board-approved continuing education (i) 18 programs; 19 (ii) Instruct any of the procedures in subdivision 20 (4)(5) of this section; and 21 (iii) Instruct basic curricula in a board-registered 22 massage therapy school as required by § 17-86-306(e); 23 (7) "Massage therapy school" means a registered and licensed 24 facility that meets and follows the required educational standards as 25 established by § 17-86-306 and all pertinent rules established by the board; 26 (8) "Massage therapy spa" means a site or premises, or portion 27 of a site or premises, in which a massage therapist practices massage; and 28 (8)(A)(9)(A) "Master massage therapist" means a person who: 29 (i) Before July 1, 2010, is a licensed and registered massage therapist who has completed no fewer than two hundred 30 31 fifty (250) hours of practical experience as a massage therapist, which may be gained in part or in whole as an assistant to an instructor in a massage 32 33 school and has completed no fewer less than one hundred twenty-five (125) 34 continuing education hours as approved by the board; 35 (ii) On or after July 1, 2010, has been an active 36 and practicing licensee and registered as a massage therapist for a period of
