35	SECTION 2. EMP	ERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determ	ined by the
36	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that in order to become a licensed		



1	optometrist in the State of Arkansas, optometrists who are licensed in other			
2	states must retake examinations if the optometrist has not taken all parts o			
3	the examination since 1997, which causes a delay in licensure and places a			
4	barrier on optometrists moving into the state; that licensure by endorsement			
5	authorizes the State Board of Optometry to license individuals with			
6	optometrist licenses in other states quickly and easily; that other states			
7	offer reciprocity to optometrists licensed in Arkansas through licensure by			
8	endorsement; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure that			
9	optometric practices are performed within the State of Arkansas with a			
10	license issued by the State Board of Optometry, to bring Arkansas laws			
11	regarding reciprocity of optometrists as quickly as possible, and to increas			
12	health care access to optometric services for the citizens of the State of			
13	Arkansas. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being			
14	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and			
15	safety shall become effective on:			
16	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
17	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
18	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
19	bill; or			
20	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
21	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
