3	(3) "Medical records" means hospital or clinic records,		
4	physicians' records, or other healthcare records, including without		
5	limitation:		
6	(A) An admissions form, discharge summary, history and		
7	physical, progress notes, physicians' orders, reports of operations, recovery		
8	room records, lab reports, consultation reports, medication administration		
9	records, nurses' notes, and other reports catalogued and maintained by the		
10	medical records department of a hospital, doctor's office, medical clinic, or		
11	any other medical facility; and		
12	(B) A paper entry, electronic entry, or image that is:		
13	(i) Captured in relation to a diagnosis, treatment,		
14	or other service provided to a child; or		
15	(ii) Relied upon by a healthcare provider to		
16	diagnose or provide treatment or other services to a child; and		
17	(4) "Parent" means a parent of a child whose:		
18	(A) Child has been removed from the custody of the parent		
19	or is in the custody of the Department of Human Services; and		
20	(B) Parental rights concerning the child have not been		
21	terminated.		
22	(b)(1) A parent, guardian, or custodian shall have the right to		
23	request and obtain the medical records of his or her child, ward, or child of		
24	whom the custodian has custody regardless of whether the child has been		
25	removed from the custody of the parent, guardian, or custodian or is in the		
26	custody of the Department of Human Services.		
27	(2)(A) A healthcare institution from which a child receives		
28	treatment or services shall provide the parent, guardian, or custodian of the		
29	child with the medical records of the child upon the request of the parent,		
30	guardian, or custodian.		
31	(B) A healthcare institution shall comply with subdivision		
32	(b)(2)(A) of this section regardless of whether the child has been removed		
33	from the custody of the parent, guardian, or custodian or is in the custody		
34	of the Department of Human Services.		
35	(c)(1) The Department of Human Services shall execute any consent		
36	required in order for a parent, guardian, or custodian to obtain the medical		

1	records of his or her child, ward, or child of whom the custodian has custody		
2	under this section.		
3	(2) A person or entity with which a child is placed shall		
4	execute any consent required in order for the parent, guardian, or custodian		
5	of the child to obtain the medical records of the child under this section.		
6	(d) A court with jurisdiction over a child shall enter an order		
7	requiring a person or entity with which the child is placed, a healthcare		
8	institution, or the Department of Human Services to comply with this section.		
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
