15	TO PROVIDE INCENTIVES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT		
16	OF AN ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT; AND TO		
17	CREATE THE ARKANSAS ENTERTAINMENT		
18	DISTRICT ACT.		
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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:		
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23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 15, Chapter 11, is amended to add an		
24	additional subchapter to read as follows:		
25	<u> Subchapter 10 — Arkansas Entertainment District Act</u>		
26			
27	<u>15-11-1001. Title.</u>		
28	This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Arkansas		
29	Entertainment District Act".		
30			
31	15-11-1002. Definitions.		
32	As used in this subchapter:		
33	(1) "Entertainment district" means a district for public and		
34	private uses that is:		
35	(A) Developed for the purpose of serving as an anchor		
36	attraction consisting of various performing arts events; and		

1	(B) Located in one (1) or more counties that do not have		
2	an individual population greater than one hundred thousand (100,000) based on		
3	the most recent federal decennial census;		
4	(2) "Entertainment item" means tangible personal property or		
5	services offered primarily for the purposes of entertainment within an		
6	entertainment district, including the following:		
7	(A) A ticket to a performing arts event, such as a		
8	concert, show, or theater production; and		
9	(B) Tangible personal property that is:		
10	(i) Related to a performing arts event, such as		
11	souvenirs, memorabilia, or clothing containing the logo or name of the		
12	performing arts event or a performing artist participating in a performing		
13	arts event; and		
14	(ii) Is sold within the entertainment district on		
15	the day of a live performing arts event;		
16	(3) "Performing arts event" means a creative activity involving		
17	drama, music, dance, or a combination of drama, music, and dance that is		
18	performed in front of a live audience within an entertainment district; and		
19	(4) "Qualifying business" means a business that:		
20	(A) Is located and conducts business in an entertainment		
21	district, including business as a nonprofit organization;		
22	(B) Derives income from the sale of entertainment items		
23	within an entertainment district;		
24	(C) Makes a capital investment of at least ten million		
25	dollars (\$10,000,000) within the entertainment district; and		
26	(D) At an establishment within one hundred (100) miles of		
27	the entertainment district and within two (2) years of locating within the		
28	entertainment district, did not cease or substantially reduce operations of a		
29	nature similar to those being performed at the business's establishment in		
30	the entertainment district.		
31			
32	15-11-1003. Creation of an entertainment district.		
33	(a) One (1) or more cities or counties, or both, may apply to the		
34	Arkansas Economic Development Commission to designate an area located wholly		
35	within the applying cities and counties as an entertainment district.		
36	(b) The application submitted under this section shall:		

1	(1) Include a written development plan that contains at least
2	the following information:
3	(A) A description of the new business activity that will
4	be conducted within the proposed entertainment district;
5	(B) Evidence of any adverse economic or socioeconomic
6	conditions within the proposed entertainment district;
7	(C) Public and private commitment to and other resources
8	available for the proposed entertainment district;
9	(D) How the designation of an entertainment district will
10	relate to the broader plan for the community as a whole;
11	(E) The level of demonstrated cooperation among the
12	applying and surrounding cities, counties, and communities;
13	(F) How any local regulatory burdens will be reduced for
14	businesses operating within the proposed entertainment district;
15	(G) A map of the proposed entertainment district that
16	indicates the geographic boundaries, the total area, and the present use and
17	conditions generally of the land and structures within the boundaries;
18	(H) A description of the methods proposed to increase
19	economic opportunity and expansion, facilitate infrastructure improvement,
20	and identify job training opportunities; and
21	(I) Any other information required by the commission;
22	(2) Be in the form and manner required by the commission;
23	(3) Contain sufficient information to allow the commission to
24	determine if the proposed entertainment district qualifies under this
25	subchapter; and
26	(4) Be submitted by the chief elected officer of each city and
27	county submitting the application or, if there is not a chief elected officer
28	of a city or county submitting the application, the governing body of the
29	city or county.
30	(c)(l) The commission shall review each application submitted under
31	this section and determine whether the proposed entertainment district meets
32	the requirements and serves the purposes of this subchapter.
33	(2) Upon approval of an application under this section, the
34	commission shall designate the proposed entertainment district.
35	
36	15-11-1004. Tax incentives.

1	In an entertainment district:	
2	(1) Each qualifying business is eligible for the income tax:	
3	(A) Exemption under § 26-51-314; and	
4	(B) Credit under § 26-51-515; and	
5	Sales of materials and services used in constructing a qualifying	
6	business are sales and use tax exemption under § 26-52-451.	
7		
8	15-11-1005. Applicability.	
9	The tax incentives provided under this subchapter:	
10	(1) May be combined with any other incentives available for the	
11	entertainment district or the businesses within the entertainment district;	
12	<u>and</u>	
13	(2) Are available for an entertainment district for fifteen (15)	
14	years from the creation of the entertainment district.	
15		
16	15-11-1006. Limitations on entertainment districts.	
17	(a) Within an entertainment district a person shall not:	
18	(1) Take an alcoholic beverage from the premises of a facility	
19	that has a permit issued by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board;	
20	(2) Consume an alcoholic beverage in an facility that does not	
21	have a permit issued by the board; or	
22	(3) Consume an alcoholic beverage outside of a facility that has	
23	a permit issued by the board.	
24	(b) The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board shall not issue a Class B	
25	Private Club License for a facility within an entertainment district.	
26		
27	<u>15-11-1007. Rules.</u>	
28	The Arkansas Economic Development Commission shall promulgate rules to	
29	implement and administer this subchapter.	
30		
31	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 26, Chapter 51, Subchapter 3, is	
32	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:	
33	26-51-314. Income from sale of entertainment items.	
34	(a) As used in this section, "entertainment district", "entertainment	
35	item", and "qualifying business" have the same meanings stated in § 15-11-	
36	1002.	

1	(b)(l) Income from the sale of an entertainment item within an		
2	entertainment district by a qualifying business is exempt from the income t		
3	levied under the Income Tax Act of 1929, § 26-51-101 et seq.		
4	(2) The exemption allowed under this section does not include		
5	income derived from Internet, mail-order, and catalog sales of entertainmen		
6	<u>items.</u>		
7			
8	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 26, Chapter 51, Subchapter 5, is		
9	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
10	26-51-515. Costs of construction in entertainment district.		
11	(a) As used in this section:		
12	(1) "Costs of construction" means:		
13	(A) Obligations incurred for labor and to vendors,		
14	contractors, subcontractors, builders, suppliers, deliverymen, and		
15	materialmen in connection with the acquisition, construction, equipping, and		
16	installation of qualifying business in an entertainment district;		
17	(B) The costs of acquiring real property or rights in real		
18	property in connection with a qualifying business in an entertainment		
19	district and any costs incidental to the acquisition of real property or		
20	rights in real property in connection with a qualifying business in an		
21	entertainment district;		
22	(C) The cost of contract bonds and insurance of all kinds		
23	that may be required or necessary during the course of the acquisition,		
24	construction, equipping, and installation of a qualifying business in an		
25	entertainment district that is not paid by the vendor, supplier, deliveryman,		
26	contractor, or otherwise provided;		
27	(D) The costs of architectural and engineering services,		
28	including without limitation estimates, plans and specifications, preliminary		
29	investigations, and supervision of construction and installation, as well as		
30	for the performance of the duties required by or consequent to the		
31	acquisition, construction, equipping, and installation of a qualifying		
32	business in an entertainment district;		
33	(E) The costs required to be paid under the terms of any		
34	contract for the acquisition, construction, equipping, and installation of a		
35	qualifying business in an entertainment district;		
36	(F) The costs required for the installation of utilities		

1	in connection with a qualifying business in an entertainment district,	
2	including without limitation water, sewer, sewage treatment, gas,	
3	electricity, communications, and off-site construction of utility extensions	
4	paid for by the qualifying business; and	
5	(G) Other costs comparable with those described in this	
6	section;	
7	(2) "Entertainment district" means the same as defined in § 15-	
8	11-1002; and	
9	(3) "Qualifying business" means the same as defined in § 15-11-	
10	<u>1002.</u>	
11	(b) There is allowed an income tax credit against the income tax	
12	imposed under this chapter in the amount equal to twenty-five percent (25%)	
13	of a qualifying business's costs of construction within an entertainment	
14	<u>district.</u>	
15	(c) The amount of the income tax credit under this section that may be	
16	claimed by the taxpayer in a tax year shall not exceed the amount of income	
17	tax due by the taxpayer.	
18	(d) Any unused income tax credit under this section may be carried	
19	forward for five (5) consecutive tax years following the tax year in which	
20	the income tax credit was earned.	
21		
22	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code Title 26, Chapter 52, Subchapter 4, is	
23	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:	
24	26-52-451. Construction materials and services in an entertainment	
25	<u>district.</u>	
26	(a) As used in this section, "qualifying business" means the same as	
27	<u>defined in § 15-11-1002.</u>	
28	(b) The gross receipts or gross proceeds derived from the sale of	
29	materials and services used in the construction of a qualifying business are	
30	exempt from the gross receipts tax levied under this chapter and the	
31	compensating use tax levied by the Arkansas Compensating Tax Act of 1949, §	
32	<u>26-53-101 et seq.</u>	
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34	SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective for tax years	

beginning on or after January 1, 2015.
