2	(i) Indemnity and managed care plans; and	
3	(ii) Nonfederal governmental plans as defined in 29

5	(C) "Health benefit plan" does not include:	
6	(i) Disability income plans;	
7	(ii) Credit insurance plans;	
8	(iii) Insurance coverage issued as a supplement to	
9	liability insurance;	
10	(iv) Medical payments under automobile or homeowners	
11	insurance plans;	
12	(v) Health benefit plans provided under Arkansas	
13	Constitution, Article 5, § 32, the Workers' Compensation Law, § 11-9-101 et	
14	<pre>seq., or the Public Employee Workers' Compensation Act, § 21-5-601 et seq.;</pre>	
15	(vi) Plans that provide only indemnity for hospital

21	(2) "Healthcare professional" means a person who is licensed,	
22	certified, or otherwise authorized by the laws of this state to administer	
23	health care in the ordinary course of the practice of his or her profession;	
24	<u>and</u>	
25	(3) "Intraoperative neurophysiological monitoring" means the use	
26	during surgery of electrophysiological methods of monitoring such as	
27	electroencephalography, electromyography, and evoked potentials:	
28	(A) To localize anatomical structures, including	
29	peripheral nerves and sensorimotor complexes, in order to guide a healthcare	
30	professional during dissection; or	
31	(B) To monitor the functional integrity of neural tissues	
32	such as the brain, spinal cords, or peripheral nerves in order to prevent	
33	irreversible damage, minimize neurological morbidity, and reduce the risk of	
34	neurological deficits that may result from surgeries that involve the nervous	
35	system.	

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1	23-79-1902. Intraoperative neurophysiological monitoring — Coverage
2	required.
3	(a)(l) This subchapter applies to a health benefit plan delivered,
4	issued for delivery, reissued, or extended in Arkansas on or after January 1,
5	2020, or at any time when any term of the health benefit plan is changed or
6	any premium adjustment is made thereafter.
7	(2) Notwithstanding subdivision (a)(1) of this section, this
8	subchapter applies to the Arkansas Medicaid Program on and after January 1,
9	<u>2020.</u>
10	(b)(1) A health benefit plan shall provide coverage and reimbursement
11	for intraoperative neurophysiological monitoring provided through
12	telemedicine under the Telemedicine Act, § 17-80-401 et seq., per hour, and
13	on the same basis as the health benefit plan provides coverage and
14	reimbursement for health services provided in person.
15	(2) Coverage and reimbursement required for intraoperative
16	neurophysiological monitoring under subdivision (b)(l) of this section
17	includes intraoperative neurophysiological monitoring provided:
18	(A) From outside the operating room, whether remotely or
19	on site; and
20	(B) For one (1) or more patients, while each patient is in
21	the operating room.
22	(c) A health benefit plan shall reimburse for intraoperative
23	neurophysiological monitoring if intraoperative neurophysiological monitoring
24	is ordered by a treating healthcare professional who has, in his or her sole
25	discretion, made the determination that the intraoperative neurophysiological
26	monitoring is necessary or appropriate.
27	(d) A health benefit plan shall reimburse for intraoperative
28	neurophysiological monitoring under Current Procedural Terminology code 95941
29	at the usual and customary rates if the interpreting healthcare professional
30	<u>is:</u>
31	(1) A physician licensed by the Arkansas State Medical Board;
32	<u>and</u>
33	(2) Privileged to render intraoperative neurophysiological
34	monitoring in a medical facility where the surgical procedure is performed.
35	(e) This subchapter prohibits a health benefit plan from limiting
36	coverage for intraoperative neurophysiological monitoring provided through

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1	telemedicine for medically necessary services, subject to the same terms and
2	conditions of the covered person's health benefit plan that apply to services
3	provided in person.
4	(f)(1) The Insurance Commissioner shall promulgate rules
5	to implement this subchapter.
6	(2)(A) When adopting the initial rules to implement this
7	subchapter, the final rule shall be filed with the Secretary of State for
8	<pre>adoption under § 25-15-204(f):</pre>
9	(i) On or before January 1, 2020; or
10	(ii) If approval under § 10-3-309 has not occurred
11	by January 1, 2020, as soon as practicable after approval under § 10-3-309.
12	(B) The commissioner shall file the proposed rule with the
13	Legislative Council under § 10-3-309(c) sufficiently in advance of January 1,
14	2020, so that the Legislative Council may consider the rule for approval
15	before January 1, 2020.
