(b) A licensing entity shall by rule adopt the least restrictive 28 29 requirements for licensing, registration, or certification for a person who: 30 (1) Demonstrates that he or she: (A) Was previously licensed, registered, or certified for 31 32 a term specified by rule of the licensing entity to practice in the field of 33 his or her profession in another state; 34 (B) Holds his or her license in good standing; 35 (C) Has not had his or her license revoked for: 36 (i) An act of bad faith; or
