6	(2)(A) "Rule" means an agency statement of general applicability		
7	and future effect that implements, interprets, or prescribes law or policy or

10	to waste management, including without limitation the amendment or repeal of		
11	a prior rule.		
12	(B) "Rule" does not mean:

23	(a)(1) By December 1, 2021, each agency that has promulgated rules		
24	pertaining to milk and cattle production, but not including other rules

27	(2)(A) The initial rule report shall contain a list of all the		
28	rules in effect promulgated by the agency that pertain to milk and cattle		
29	production, but not including other rules pertaining solely to waste

31	(B) The list of rules under subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this

33	(i) The initial effective date of each rule;

8	(e)(1) Upon receipt of the recommendations of the House Committee on
9	Agriculture, Forestry, and Economic Development and the Senate Committee on
10	Agriculture, Forestry, and Economic Development, the Legislative Council
11	shall vote no later than December 31, 2022, to determine whether each rule
12	shall:
13	(A) Continue to remain in effect; or
14	(B) Be repealed.
15	(2) If the Legislative Council votes to repeal a rule, the rule
16	shall sunset after December 31, 2022.
