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1 abnormalities; 2 (B) All images are reviewed by the physician interpreting 3 the study, and additional views are obtained as needed; and (C) A physical examination of the breast by the 4 5 interpreting physician to correlate the radiologic findings is often 6 performed as part of the study; 7 (3) "Mammography" means radiography of the breast+; and 8 (2)(4)(A) "Screening mammography", including digital breast 9 tomosynthesis, is means a radiologic procedure provided to a woman, who has 10 no signs or symptoms of breast cancer, for the purpose of early detection of 11 breast cancer. 12 (B) The procedure entails at least two (2) views of each 13 breast and includes a physician's interpretation of the results of the 14 procedure. 15 (3) "Diagnostic mammography" is a problem-solving radiologic 16 procedure of higher intensity than screening mammography provided to women 17 who are suspected to have breast pathology. Patients are usually referred 18 for analysis of palpable abnormalities or for further evaluation of 19 mammographically detected abnormalities. All images are immediately reviewed 20 by the physician interpreting the study, and additional views are obtained as 21 needed. A physical examination of the breast by the interpreting physician 22 to correlate the radiologic findings is often performed as part of the study. 23 24 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 23-79-140(b), concerning mammograms, is 25 amended to read as follows: 26 (b) Every accident and health insurance company, hospital service 27 corporation, health maintenance organization, or other accident and health 28 insurance provider in the State of Arkansas shall offer, after January 1, 29 1990, to each master group contract holder as an optional essential health benefit, coverage for at least the following mammogram screening mammography 30 and breast ultrasound for the diagnosis of breast disease such as cancer and 31 32 the evaluation of dense breast including: 33 (1) A baseline mammogram for a woman covered by such a policy 34 who is thirty-five to forty (35-40) years of age; 35 (2) A mammogram for a woman covered by such a policy who is

forty to forty-nine (40-49) years of age, inclusive, every one to two (1-2)

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1 years based on the recommendation of the woman's physician; 2 (3) A mammogram each year for a woman covered by such a policy 3 who is at least fifty (50) years of age; 4 (4) Upon recommendation of a woman's physician, without regard 5 to age, when the woman has had a prior history of breast cancer, or when the 6 woman's mother or sister has had a history of breast cancer, positive genetic 7 testing, or other risk factors; and 8 (5) A comprehensive ultrasound screening of an entire breast or breasts if a mammogram screening demonstrates heterogeneous or dense breast 9 tissue when the woman's physician determines a comprehensive ultrasound 10 11 screening is medically necessary; and 12 (6) Insurance coverage for screening mammograms, including digital breast tomosynthesis, and breast ultrasounds will shall not prejudice 13 14 coverage for diagnostic mammograms or breast ultrasounds as recommended by 15 the woman's physician. 16 17 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 23-79-140(c), concerning payment for 18 screening mammograms, is repealed. 19 (c)(1) The insurers shall pay not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) for 20 each screening mammogram, which shall include payment for both the 21 professional and technical components 22 (2) In case of hospital out-patient screening mammography, and 23 comparable situations, when there is a claim for professional sevices separate from the claim for technical services, the claim for the 24 25 professional component will not be less than forty percent (40%) of the total 26 fee. 27 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 23-79-140, concerning mammograms, is 28 29 amended to add an additional subsection to read as follows: 30 (f)(1) Benefits under this section are subject to any policy provisions that apply to other services covered by the policy, except that an 31 32 insurance policy shall not impose a copayment or deductible for a screening 33 mammogram. 34 (2) A breast ultrasound may be subject to any applicable copayment as required under a health benefit plan but shall not be subject to 35 36 a deductible.

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
