8	TO ENCOURAGE CONTINUED COLLABORATION BETWEEN HEALTH
9	CARE PROVIDERS, LAW ENFORCEMENT, EDUCATORS, PUBLIC
10	OFFICIALS, AND THE ARKANSAS COMMUNITY IN BATTLING THE
11	ABUSE OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS IN ARKANSAS.

15	TO ENCOURAGE CONTINUED COLLABORATION
16	BETWEEN HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS, LAW
17	ENFORCEMENT, EDUCATORS, PUBLIC OFFICIALS,
18	AND THE ARKANSAS COMMUNITY IN BATTLING
19	THE ABUSE OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS IN
20	ARKANSAS.

23	WHEREAS, in 2010, Arkansas had the 25th highest drug overdose mortality
24	rate in the United States, with 12.5 per 100,000 people suffering drug
25	overdose fatalities and prescription drugs are most frequently named in drug-
26	related death certificates; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, prescription drug overdoses account for at least one death per
29	day in Arkansas; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, the number of drug overdose deaths in Arkansas, a majority of
32	which are from prescription drugs, has more than doubled since 1999 when the
33	rate was 4.4 per 100,000; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, Arkansas ranks 5th in the nation in the percentage of people
36	12 years of age or older who used prescription pain relievers for nonmedical



1 purposes in 2012-2013, with 22% of high school students taking prescription 2 drugs without a doctor's prescription in 2008; and 3 4 WHEREAS, in 2010, Arkansas had the nation's 12th highest rate of 5 prescription painkillers sold; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the misuse of prescription drugs can have dire consequences 8 and the rapid rise of abuse requires a full-scale response from health care 9 providers, law enforcement, educators, public officials, and the Arkansas 10 community; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the people of Arkansas have a duty to educate our communities, 13 protect our medications at home, properly dispose of unwanted or unneeded 14 medications, promote responsible prescribing and dispensing of prescription 15 medications, encourage proper safeguarding of prescription medication 16 inventories, and help those struggling to overcome prescription drug 17 addictions, 18 19 NOW THEREFORE, 20 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETIETH GENERAL 21 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 22 23 THAT the House of Representatives encourages the continued 24 collaboration between health providers, law enforcement, educators, public 25 officials, and the Arkansas community in battling the abuse of prescription 26 drugs in Arkansas. 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon its adoption a copy of this resolution 29 be presented by the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives to: Diane 30 Skaggs, executive director of the Mental Health Council of Arkansas; Dr. 31 Carol Baxter, executive director of Recovery Centers of Arkansas; 32 Dr. Bradley Diner, Program Coordinator of the Arkansas Medical Foundation; 33 Dr. Michael Mancino, Associate Professor Program for the Department of 34 Psychiatry, and Director of the Center for Addiction Services and Treatment 35 at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences; Dr. Carlos Roman, Chief 36 of Pain Management at St. Vincent Infirmary and Chair of Arkansas State
